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- 2 relating to the prosecution of the offense of theft of service.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 31.04, Penal Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (a) A person commits theft of service if, with intent to
- 8 avoid payment for service that the actor [he] knows is provided only
- 9 for compensation:
- 10 (1) the actor [he] intentionally or knowingly secures
- 11 performance of the service by deception, threat, or false token;
- 12 (2) having control over the disposition of services of
- 13 another to which the actor [he] is not entitled, the actor [he]
- 14 intentionally or knowingly diverts the other's services to the
- 15 actor's [his] own benefit or to the benefit of another not entitled
- 16 to the services [them];
- 17 (3) having control of personal property under a
- 18 written rental agreement, the actor [he] holds the property beyond
- 19 the expiration of the rental period without the effective consent
- 20 of the owner of the property, thereby depriving the owner of the
- 21 property of its use in further rentals; or
- 22 (4) the actor [he] intentionally or knowingly secures
- 23 the performance of the service by agreeing to provide compensation
- 24 and, after the service is rendered, fails to make full payment after

- 1 receiving notice demanding payment.
- 2 (d-1) For purposes of Subsection (a) (4):
- 3 (1) if the compensation is or was to be paid on a
- 4 periodic basis, the intent to avoid payment for a service may be
- 5 formed at any time during or before a pay period; and
- 6 (2) the partial payment of wages alone is not
- 7 sufficient evidence to negate the actor's intent to avoid payment
- 8 for a service.
- 9 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 10 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 13 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 14 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 15 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 16 before that date.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
