## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the conduct and administration of elections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 31.035, Election Code, is transferred to
- 5 Subchapter E, Chapter 31, Election Code, redesignated as Section
- 6 31.124, Election Code, and amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 31.124 [31.035]. RESTRICTIONS ON POLITICAL
- 8 ACTIVITIES. (a) A county elections administrator or other
- 9 government official who oversees, manages, or administers the
- 10 election process may not be a candidate for a public office or an
- 11 office of a political party, hold a public office, or hold an office
- 12 of or position in a political party. At the time an administrator
- 13 or official becomes a candidate or accepts an office or position in
- 14 violation of this subsection, the administrator or official vacates
- 15 the position [of administrator].
- 16 (b) A county elections administrator commits an offense if
- 17 the administrator makes a political contribution or political
- 18 expenditure, as defined by the law regulating political funds and
- 19 campaigns, or publicly supports or opposes a candidate for public
- 20 office or a measure to be voted on at an election. An offense under
- 21 this subsection is a Class A misdemeanor. On a final conviction,
- 22 the administrator's employment is terminated, and the person
- 23 convicted is ineligible for future appointment as county elections
- 24 administrator.

- 1 (c) In this section, "candidate" means a person who has
- 2 taken affirmative action, as described by the law regulating
- 3 political funds and campaigns, for the purpose of gaining
- 4 nomination or election.
- 5 (d) This section does not apply to a county clerk or a county
- 6 tax assessor-collector.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 32, Election Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 32.076 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 32.076. OBSERVING VOTER ASSISTANCE. (a) The
- 10 presiding judge or alternate presiding judge may observe assistance
- 11 being provided to a voter to ensure compliance with the oath taken
- 12 under Section 64.034 and that Section 64.036(a) is not being
- 13 violated if the judge has reason to believe that a person assisting
- 14 a voter under Section 64.032(c) is violating Section 64.036(a) or
- 15 the oath taken under Section 64.034.
- 16 (b) If a watcher appointed under Chapter 33 requests the
- 17 observation under Section 33.057(c), two election officers
- 18 affiliated or aligned with different political parties shall
- 19 observe the assistance provided to a voter to ensure that the person
- 20 assisting the voter complies with the oath taken under Section
- 21 64.034 and does not violate Section 64.036(a).
- SECTION 3. Section 33.057, Election Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 24 (c) A watcher may request that two election officers
- 25 affiliated or aligned with different political parties observe the
- 26 assistance provided to a voter to ensure that the person assisting
- 27 the voter complies with the oath taken under Section 64.034 and does

- 1 not violate Section 64.036(a).
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 43.007, Election Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsections (k) and (l) to read as follows:
- 4 (k) Each county that previously participated in a program
- 5 under this section is authorized to continue participation in the
- 6 program for future elections described by Subsection (a) if:
- 7 (1) the commissioners court of the county approves
- 8 participation in the program; and
- 9 (2) the secretary of state determines the county's
- 10 participation in the program was successful.
- 11 (1) Subsections (b), (c), (d), and (i) do not apply to a
- 12 county participating in the program under Subsection (k).
- SECTION 5. Subchapter E, Chapter 127, Election Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 127.1311 to read as follows:
- Sec. 127.1311. ANNOUNCING UNOFFICIAL RESULTS. (a) Except
- 16 as provided by Subsection (b), unofficial election results shall be
- 17 released as soon as they are available after the polls close.
- 18 (b) The presiding judge of the central counting station, in
- 19 cooperation with the county clerk, may withhold the release of
- 20 unofficial election results until the last voter has voted.
- SECTION 6. Section 573.061, Government Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 573.061. GENERAL EXCEPTIONS. Section 573.041 does not
- 24 apply to:
- 25 (1) an appointment to the office of a notary public or
- 26 to the confirmation of that appointment;
- 27 (2) an appointment of a page, secretary, attendant, or

- 1 other employee by the legislature for attendance on any member of
- 2 the legislature who, because of physical infirmities, is required
- 3 to have a personal attendant;
- 4 (3) a confirmation of the appointment of an appointee
- 5 appointed to a first term on a date when no individual related to
- 6 the appointee within a degree described by Section 573.002 was a
- 7 member of or a candidate for the legislature, or confirmation on
- 8 reappointment of the appointee to any subsequent consecutive term;
- 9 (4) an appointment or employment of a bus driver by a
- 10 school district if:
- 11 (A) the district is located wholly in a county
- 12 with a population of less than 35,000; or
- 13 (B) the district is located in more than one
- 14 county and the county in which the largest part of the district is
- 15 located has a population of less than 35,000;
- 16 (5) an appointment or employment of a personal
- 17 attendant by an officer of the state or a political subdivision of
- 18 the state for attendance on the officer who, because of physical
- 19 infirmities, is required to have a personal attendant;
- 20 (6) an appointment or employment of a substitute
- 21 teacher by a school district; [or]
- 22 (7) an appointment or employment of a person by a
- 23 municipality that has a population of less than 200; or
- 24 (8) an appointment of an election clerk under Section
- 25 32.031, Election Code, who is not related in the first degree by
- 26 consanguinity or affinity to an elected official of the authority
- 27 that appoints the election judges for that election.

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1 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
