A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a study of and report on public and private 3 out-of-school time programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 29.9181 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 29.9181. STUDY OF AND REPORT ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE
- 8 OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME PROGRAMS. (a) In this section, "out-of-school
- 9 time program" means a community-based or school-based program
- 10 designed to provide a wide range of services and activities,
- 11 including counseling, mentoring, career exploration, academic
- 12 assistance, and sports and recreation, to children and youth before
- 13 and after school and on weekends.
- (b) The agency shall conduct a study of public and private
- 15 out-of-school time programs in this state to determine:
- 16 (1) the number of children served by a public or
- 17 private out-of-school time program;
- 18 (2) the number and location of children who could
- 19 benefit from but are not served by an out-of-school time program;
- 20 (3) federal, state, and local funding sources and
- 21 amounts that currently support out-of-school time programs;
- 22 (4) the extent of any effect of out-of-school time
- 23 programs on reducing the dropout rate and improving academic
- 24 performance; and

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- 1 (5) the best practices for out-of-school time programs
- 2 to achieve a reduction in the dropout rate and improvement in
- 3 <u>academic performance.</u>
- 4 (c) The agency may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or
- 5 donation from any source, including a foundation or private entity,
- 6 for the study. The study may be conducted only if sufficient funds
- 7 are available under this subsection for that purpose.
- 8 (d) Not later than December 1, 2012, the agency shall submit
- 9 to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house
- 10 of representatives, and the presiding officer of each legislative
- 11 standing committee with primary jurisdiction over primary and
- 12 secondary education a written report that contains the results of
- 13 the study.
- 14 (e) This section expires December 31, 2012.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
