A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the adoption by health care facilities of a policy on
3	vaccine preventable diseases; imposing penalties.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Subtitle A, Title 4, Health and
6	Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	SUBTITLE A. FINANCING, CONSTRUCTING, REGULATING, AND INSPECTING
8	HEALTH FACILITIES
9	SECTION 2. Subtitle A, Title 4, Health and Safety Code, is
10	amended by adding Chapter 224 to read as follows:
11	CHAPTER 224. POLICY ON VACCINE PREVENTABLE DISEASES
12	Sec. 224.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
13	(1) "Health care facility" means:
14	(A) a facility licensed under Subtitle B of this
15	title, including a hospital as defined by Section 241.003; or
16	(B) a hospital maintained or operated by this
17	state.
18	(2) "Employee" includes:
19	(A) an individual providing direct patient care
20	pursuant to a contract with a health care facility; and
21	(B) an individual to whom a health care facility
22	has granted privileges to provide direct patient care.
23	(3) "Regulatory authority" means a state agency that
24	regulates a health care facility under this code.

- 1 (4) "Vaccine preventable diseases" means the diseases
- 2 included in the most current recommendations of the Advisory
- 3 Committee on Immunization Practices of the Centers for Disease
- 4 Control and Prevention.
- 5 Sec. 224.002. VACCINE PREVENTABLE DISEASES POLICY
- 6 REQUIRED. (a) Each health care facility shall develop and
- 7 implement a policy to protect its patients from vaccine preventable
- 8 <u>diseases.</u>
- 9 (b) The policy must:
- 10 (1) require the employees of the health care facility
- 11 to receive vaccines for the vaccine preventable diseases specified
- 12 by the facility based on the level of risk the employee presents to
- 13 patients by the employee's routine and direct exposure to patients;
- 14 (2) specify the vaccines a health care facility
- 15 employee is required to receive based on the level of risk the
- 16 employee presents to patients by the employee's routine and direct
- 17 <u>exposure to patients;</u>
- 18 (3) include procedures for verifying whether a health
- 19 care facility employee has complied with the policy;
- 20 (4) include procedures for a health care facility
- 21 employee to be exempt from the required vaccines for medical
- 22 <u>reasons;</u>
- 23 (5) for a health care facility employee who is exempt
- 24 from the required vaccines, include procedures the employee must
- 25 follow to protect facility patients from exposure to disease, such
- 26 as wearing a mask, based on the level of risk the employee presents
- 27 to patients by the employee's routine and direct exposure to

- 2 (6) require the health care facility to maintain a
- 3 written or electronic record of each health care facility
- 4 employee's compliance with or exemption from the policy; and
- 5 (7) include disciplinary actions the health care
- 6 facility is authorized to take against a health care facility
- 7 employee who fails to comply with the policy.
- 8 <u>(c) The policy may include procedures for a health care</u>
- 9 facility employee to be exempt from the required vaccines based on
- 10 reasons of conscience, including a religious belief.
- Sec. 224.003. DISASTER EXEMPTION. (a) In this section,
- 12 "public health disaster" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 13 81.003.
- 14 (b) During a public health disaster, a health care facility
- 15 may prohibit an employee who is exempt from the vaccines required in
- 16 the policy developed by the facility under Section 224.002 from
- 17 having contact with facility patients.
- 18 Sec. 224.004. DISCIPLINARY ACTION. A health care facility
- 19 that violates this chapter is subject to an administrative or civil
- 20 penalty in the same manner, and subject to the same procedures, as
- 21 if the facility had violated a provision of this code that
- 22 <u>specifically governs the facility.</u>
- Sec. 224.005. RULES. The appropriate rulemaking authority
- 24 for each regulatory authority shall adopt rules necessary to
- 25 implement this chapter.
- SECTION 3. Not later than June 1, 2012, a state agency that
- 27 regulates a health care facility subject to Chapter 224, Health and

- 1 Safety Code, as added by this Act, shall adopt the rules necessary
- 2 to implement that chapter.
- 3 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Chapter 224, Health and Safety
- 4 Code, as added by this Act, a health care facility subject to that
- 5 chapter is not required to have a policy on vaccine preventable
- 6 diseases in effect until September 1, 2012.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
