5	SECTION 1. The heading to Subtitle A, Title 4, Health and
6	Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

9	SECTION 2. Subtitle A, Title 4, Health and Safety Code, is
10	amended by adding Chapter 224 to read as follows:

12	Sec. 224.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
13	(1) "Health care facility" means a hospital or another
14	facility licensed under Subtitle B of this title or under Chapter
15	577 to provide inpatient medical care, health care, or mental

- 18 241.003.

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- 19 (3) "Regulatory authority" means a state agency that
- 20 <u>regulates a health care facility under this code.</u>

- 21 (3) "Vaccine preventable diseases" means the diseases
- 22 <u>included</u> in the most current recommendations of the Advisory
- 23 Committee on Immunization Practices of the Centers for Disease
- 24 Control and Prevention.

- 1 Sec. 224.002. VACCINE PREVENTABLE DISEASES POLICY
- 2 REQUIRED. (a) Each health care facility shall develop and
- 3 implement a policy to protect its patients from vaccine preventable
- 4 diseases.
- 5 (b) The policy must:
- 6 (1) require the employees of the health care facility
- 7 to receive vaccines for the vaccine preventable diseases identified
- 8 <u>in the policy;</u>
- 9 (2) include procedures for verifying whether a health
- 10 care facility employee has complied with the policy;
- 11 (3) include procedures for a health care facility
- 12 employee to be exempt from the required vaccines for medical
- 13 <u>reasons;</u>
- 14 (4) for a health care facility employee who is exempt
- 15 from the required vaccines, include procedures the employee must
- 16 follow to protect facility patients from exposure to disease, such
- 17 <u>as wearing a mask, based on the level of risk the employee presents</u>
- 18 to patients by the employee's exposure to patients;
- 19 <u>(5) require the health care facility to maintain a</u>
- 20 written or electronic record of each health care facility
- 21 employee's compliance with or exemption from the policy; and
- 22 (6) include disciplinary actions the health care
- 23 <u>facility</u> is authorized to take against a health care facility
- 24 employee who fails to comply with the policy.
- 25 (c) The policy may include procedures for a health care
- 26 facility employee to be exempt from the required vaccines based on
- 27 reasons of conscience, including a religious belief.

- 1 Sec. 224.003. DISCIPLINARY ACTION. A health care facility
- 2 that violates this chapter is subject to an administrative or civil
- 3 penalty in the same manner, and subject to the same procedures, as
- 4 if the facility had violated a provision of this code that
- 5 specifically governs the facility.
- 6 Sec. 224.004. RULES. The appropriate rulemaking authority
- 7 for each regulatory authority shall adopt rules necessary to
- 8 <u>implement this chapter.</u>
- 9 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2012, a state agency
- 10 that regulates a health care facility subject to Chapter 224,
- 11 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, shall adopt the rules
- 12 necessary to implement that chapter.
- 13 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Chapter 224, Health and Safety
- 14 Code, as added by this Act, a health care facility subject to that
- 15 chapter is not required to have a policy on vaccine preventable
- 16 diseases in effect until September 1, 2012.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
