## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the advisory committee on Medicaid and child health
- 3 plan program rate and expenditure disparities between the
- 4 Texas-Mexico border region and other areas of the state.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subdivision (2), Subsection (a), Section
- 7 531.0223, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (2) "Committee" means the advisory committee on
- 9 Medicaid and child health plan program rate and expenditure
- 10 [funding] disparities between the Texas-Mexico border region and
- 11 other areas of the state [in health programs] appointed by the
- 12 executive commissioner under this section.
- SECTION 2. Subsections (b) through (e), (o), and (p),
- 14 Section 531.0223, Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) The executive commissioner shall appoint an advisory
- 16 committee to develop a strategic plan for eliminating the
- 17 disparities between the Texas-Mexico border region and other areas
- 18 of the state in:
- 19 (1) capitation rates under Medicaid managed care and
- 20 the child health plan program for services provided to persons
- 21 younger than 19 years of age;
- 22 (2) fee-for-service per capita expenditures under the
- 23 Medicaid program and the child health plan program for inpatient
- 24 and outpatient hospital services for services provided to persons

- 1 younger than 19 years of age; and
- 2 (3) total professional services expenditures per
- 3 Medicaid recipient younger than 19 years of age or per child
- 4 enrolled in the child health plan program.
- 5 (c) Periodically the committee shall perform the research
- 6 necessary to analyze and compare the rates and expenditures
- 7 described by Subsection (b) and, not later than the date specified
- 8 by the executive commissioner, produce a report based on the
- 9 results of that analysis and comparison.
- 10 (d) The committee shall, as part of the report required by
- 11 Subsection (c), make recommendations to the <u>executive</u> commissioner
- 12 for addressing the problems created by disparities documented in
- 13 the report, including recommendations for allocation of funds.
- 14 (e) The executive commissioner shall appoint nine members
- 15 to the advisory committee in a manner that ensures that the
- 16 committee:
- 17 (1) represents the spectrum of geographic areas
- 18 included in the Texas-Mexico border region;
- 19 (2) includes persons who are knowledgeable regarding
- 20 the Medicaid program, including Medicaid managed care, and the
- 21 child health plan program; and
- 22 (3) represents the interests of physicians,
- 23 hospitals, patients, managed care organizations, state agencies
- 24 involved in the management and delivery of medical resources of any
- 25 kind, affected communities, and other areas of the state.
- 26 (o) The commission shall [contract with a public university
- 27 <del>to</del>]:

- 1 (1) measure changes occurring from September 1, 2002
- 2 [2001], to August 31, 2014 [2004], in the number of health care
- 3 providers participating in the Medicaid program or the child health
- 4 plan program in the Texas-Mexico border region and resulting
- 5 effects on consumer access to health care and consumer utilization;
- 6 (2) determine:
- 7 (A) the effects, if any, of the changes in rates
- 8 and expenditures required by Subsection (k); and
- 9 (B) if funding available and used for changes in
- 10 rates and expenditures was sufficient to produce measurable
- 11 effects;
- 12 (3) make a recommendation regarding whether Medicaid
- 13 rate increases should be expanded to include Medicaid services
- 14 provided to adults in the Texas-Mexico border region; and
- 15 (4) not later than December 1, 2014 [<del>2004</del>], submit a
- 16 report to the legislature.
- 17 (p) This section expires September 1, 2015 [2011].
- 18 SECTION 3. The advisory committee on Medicaid and child
- 19 health plan program rate and expenditure disparities between the
- 20 Texas-Mexico border region and other areas of the state is
- 21 re-created in accordance with Section 531.0223, Government Code, as
- 22 amended by this Act. Not later than December 1, 2011, the executive
- 23 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 24 appoint the members of the advisory committee as required by that
- 25 section.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 4 legislative session.
