Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is 6 7 amended by adding Section 37.0814 to read as follows: Sec. 37.0814. USE OF OC SPRAY, STUN GUN, OR TASER AGAINST 8 9 STUDENTS PROHIBITED. (a) In this section: (1) "OC spray" means any aerosol-propelled 10 debilitation device that is composed of a lachrymatory chemical 11 compound that irritates the eyes to cause tears, pain, or temporary 12 blindness. The term includes pepper spray, capsicum spray, OC gas, 13 14 and oleoresin capsicum. (2) "Stun gun" has the meaning assigned by Section 15 38.14, Penal Code. 16 (3) "Taser" means a device that is intended, designed, 17 made, or adapted to incapacitate a person by inflicting an 18 electrical charge through the emission of a projectile or 19 conductive stream. 20 21 (b) The board of trustees of a school district shall prohibit school district peace officers, security personnel, and 22 23 other employees from using OC spray or a stun gun or taser to subdue a student on school property or while attending a school-sponsored 24

1 or school-related activity off of school property.

2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
