3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 773, Health and Safety
5	Code, is amended by adding Sections 773.0506 and 773.0507 to read as
6	follows:
7	Sec. 773.0506. ACCREDITATION OF PARAMEDIC TRAINING
8	PROGRAMS. (a) The department shall post on the department's
9	Internet website information related to the accreditation process
10	for a paramedic training program, including a schedule of workshops
11	and online seminars related to the accreditation process.
12	(b) In awarding local project grant funds intended for
13	paramedic training programs, the department shall give priority to
14	<pre>paramedic training programs that:</pre>
15	(1) serve a rural area of the state;
16	(2) serve an area of the state along the international
17	border;
18	(3) are financially sound but have a demonstrated need
19	for financial help to become accredited; or
20	(4) are unable to enter into a consortium agreement
21	because of geographic location.
22	Sec. 773.0507. PARAMEDIC TRAINING PROGRAM ACCREDITATION
23	STUDY. (a) The advisory council established under Section 773.012
24	shall coordinate with the department and the Texas Department of

- 1 Rural Affairs to study the effect that a national accreditation
- 2 requirement would have on:
- 4 (2) the availability of paramedic training programs in
- 5 rural areas of this state; and
- 6 (3) the availability of paramedics in rural areas of
- 7 the state and areas of the state along the international border.
- 8 (b) The study must evaluate the options for accrediting
- 9 paramedic training program providers in this state, including
- 10 examining the requirements in other states relating to paramedic
- 11 training programs.
- 12 (c) Not later than September 1, 2012, the advisory council
- 13 shall report to the legislature the findings of the study and the
- 14 council's recommendations regarding paramedic training that will
- 15 increase the availability of high-quality paramedic training
- 16 programs in urban and rural areas of this state.
- 17 (d) This section expires September 1, 2013.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
