A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

_	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the regulation of the towing and storage of vehicles.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 2303.160, Occupations
- 5 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 2303.160. RELEASE OF VEHICLES AND CARGO.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 2303.160, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 9 (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (c)(1), a vehicle storage
- 10 <u>facility</u> shall release the cargo of a commercial carrier vehicle
- 11 received by the facility:
- 12 (1) to a person listed in a bill of lading, manifest,
- 13 or other transport or cargo ownership document or to the listed
- 14 person's representative;
- 15 (2) within one hour of receipt of a written request;
- 16 and
- 17 (3) without charging a fee.
- SECTION 3. Section 2308.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 by adding Subdivision (1-d) to read as follows:
- 20 <u>(1-d) "Commercial carrier" includes a passenger</u>
- 21 commercial carrier.
- SECTION 4. Section 2308.051(a), Occupations Code, as
- 23 amended by Chapters 457 (H.B. 2548) and 845 (S.B. 2153), Acts of the
- 24 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, is reenacted and amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The advisory board consists of the following members
- 3 appointed by the presiding officer of the commission with the
- 4 approval of the commission:
- 5 (1) one representative of a towing company operating
- 6 in a county with a population of less than one million;
- 7 (2) one representative of a towing company operating
- 8 in a county with a population of one million or more;
- 9 (3) one owner of a vehicle storage facility located in
- 10 a county with a population of less than one million;
- 11 (4) one owner of a vehicle storage facility located in
- 12 a county with a population of one million or more;
- 13 (5) one parking facility owner;
- 14 (6) one law enforcement officer from a county with a
- 15 population of less than one million;
- 16 (7) one law enforcement officer from a county with a
- 17 population of one million or more;
- 18 (8) one representative of property and casualty
- 19 insurers who write automobile insurance in this state; [and]
- 20 (9) one representative of a booting company;
- 21 (10) one representative of a trucking company;
- 22 (11) one representative of a passenger commercial
- 23 <u>carrier; and</u>
- (12) $\left[\frac{(9)}{(9)}\right]$ one public member.
- 25 SECTION 5. Subchapter I, Chapter 2308, Occupations Code, is
- 26 amended by adding Section 2308.408 to read as follows:
- Sec. 2308.408. PROCEDURE FOR INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TOW WITH

- 1 $\,$ OWNER OR OPERATOR PRESENT. (a) This section applies to an incident
- 2 management tow when the owner or operator of the vehicle is present
- 3 at the time of the tow, including a tow that involves a commercial
- 4 carrier.
- 5 (b) Before towing a vehicle, the tow truck operator shall:
- 6 (1) present a schedule of fees applicable to the tow to
- 7 the owner or operator of the vehicle;
- 8 (2) obtain the name, telephone number, and address or
- 9 business address of the owner or operator;
- 10 (3) obtain the name, telephone number, and address or
- 11 business address of the person authorizing the tow; and
- 12 (4) prepare in duplicate and present to the owner or
- 13 operator a statement containing:
- 14 (A) the name and address of the tow company;
- 15 (B) the permit number of the certificate issued
- 16 under Section 2308.106(b);
- 17 (C) the license plate number of the tow truck;
- 18 (D) the license plate number of the vehicle
- 19 towed;
- (E) the name, telephone number, and address or
- 21 business address of the owner or operator of the vehicle to be
- 22 towed;
- (F) the name, telephone number, and address or
- 24 business address of the person authorizing the tow;
- (G) the total amount charged for the tow,
- 26 including the number of miles towed;
- 27 (H) the daily rate of the vehicle storage

- 1 facility to which the vehicle will be towed; and
- 2 (I) a separate listing for all recovery fees
- 3 associated with the tow.
- 4 (c) The tow company shall keep a copy of the statement
- 5 prepared under Subsection (b) until the first anniversary of the
- 6 date of the tow and make the information available to the department
- 7 on request. The tow truck operator shall make the information
- 8 required by Subsection (b)(3)(E) available to law enforcement on
- 9 request.
- 10 (d) The tow company shall submit a report monthly to the
- 11 department containing for each tow that involved a commercial
- 12 <u>carrier:</u>
- 13 (1) the number of miles towed for each tow;
- 14 (2) the amount charged for towing; and
- 15 (3) any amount charged for recovery.
- SECTION 6. Promptly after the effective date of this Act,
- 17 the presiding officer of the Texas Commission of Licensing and
- 18 Regulation shall appoint to the Towing, Storage, and Booting
- 19 Advisory Board a representative of a trucking company and a
- 20 representative of a passenger commercial carrier, as required by
- 21 Section 2308.051(a), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act. The
- 22 presiding officer shall appoint one representative to a term
- 23 expiring February 1, 2013, and one member to a term expiring
- 24 February 1, 2015.
- 25 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 26 2303.160, Occupations Code, apply only to a vehicle received in
- 27 storage on or after the effective date of this Act. A vehicle

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- 1 received in storage before the effective date of this Act is
- 2 governed by the law in effect on the date the vehicle was received
- 3 by the facility, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 4 purpose.
- 5 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
