A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to archeological cemeteries.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 711.001, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subdivisions (1) and (1-a) and adding
- 6 Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Archeological cemetery" means an unmarked or
- 8 abandoned cemetery that has been designated as an archeological
- 9 cemetery by the Texas Historical Commission in accordance with
- 10 criteria established under commission rule.
- 11 (1-a) "Burial park" means a tract of land that is used
- 12 or intended to be used for interment in graves.
- 13 $\underline{(1-b)}$ [$\underline{(1-a)}$] "Campus" means the area:
- 14 (A) within the boundaries of one or more adjacent
- 15 tracts, parcels, or lots under common ownership;
- 16 (B) on which the principal church building and
- 17 related structures and facilities of an organized religious society
- 18 or sect are located; and
- 19 (C) that may be subject to one or more easements
- 20 for street, utility, or pipeline purposes.
- 21 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 711.010, Health and
- 22 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The owner of property on which an unknown cemetery is
- 24 discovered or on which an abandoned cemetery is located may not

- 1 construct improvements on the property in a manner that would
- 2 further disturb the cemetery until the human remains interred in
- 3 the cemetery are removed under:
- 4 (1) either:
- 5 (A) a written order issued by the state registrar
- 6 or the state registrar's designee under Section 711.004(f); or
- 7 (B) for an archeological cemetery, a permit
- 8 <u>issued by the Texas Historical Commission;</u> and
- 9 <u>(2)</u> [under] an order of a district court as provided by
- 10 this section.
- 11 SECTION 3. Subsection (a), Section 711.0105, Health and
- 12 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) Except as provided by this subsection, the [The] removal
- 14 of remains authorized under this chapter shall be supervised by a
- 15 cemetery keeper, a licensed funeral director, a medical examiner, a
- 16 coroner, or a professional archeologist. The removal of remains
- 17 from an archeological cemetery may only be supervised by a
- 18 professional archeologist that meets any qualifications
- 19 established by the Texas Historical Commission.
- SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 711.011, Health and
- 21 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a [A]
- 23 person who discovers an unknown or abandoned cemetery shall file
- 24 notice of the cemetery with the county clerk of the county in which
- 25 the cemetery is located not later than the <u>90th</u> [10th] day after the
- 26 date of the discovery. The notice must contain a legal description
- 27 of the land on which the unknown or abandoned cemetery was found and

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- 1 describe the approximate location of the cemetery and the evidence
- 2 of the cemetery that was discovered. <u>To protect an archeological</u>
- 3 cemetery from looting or other desecration, a person who discovers
- 4 <u>a cemetery the person reasonably believes might be an archeological</u>
- 5 cemetery shall report the discovery to the Texas Historical
- 6 Commission but is not required to file notice with the county clerk
- 7 as required by this section.
- 8 SECTION 5. Section 711.041, Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 10 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a
- 11 member of the public may access an archeological cemetery only if
- 12 the Texas Historical Commission issues a written authorization for
- 13 the public access.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
