Sections 164.0511 and 301.4522, Occupations 3 4 Code, as added by this Act, apply only to the investigation of a complaint or a disciplinary action based on a complaint filed on or 5 after the effective date of this Act. The investigation of a 6 complaint or a disciplinary action based on a complaint filed 7 before that date is governed by the law in effect on the date the 8 complaint was filed, and that law is continued in effect for that 9 purpose. 10

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
