The legislature finds that tick-borne diseases 1**-**14 1**-**15 are an important public health issue in Texas. The legislature further finds that medical and nursing education on the appropriate 1-16 care and treatment of tick-borne diseases is essential to the 1-17 delivery of necessary health care to individuals in Texas suffering from tick-borne diseases.
