A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to an appraisal and professional development system for
- 3 public school principals.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 21.354, Education Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 21.354. APPRAISAL OF <u>CERTAIN</u> ADMINISTRATORS.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 21.354, Education Code, is amended by
- 9 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 10 <u>(a-1)</u> This section does not apply to the appraisal of the
- 11 performance of a principal.
- 12 SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Section 21.3541 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 21.3541. APPRAISAL AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
- 15 SYSTEM FOR PRINCIPALS. (a) The commissioner by rule shall
- 16 establish and shall administer a comprehensive appraisal and
- 17 professional development system for principals.
- 18 <u>(b) The commissioner may establish a consortium of</u>
- 19 <u>nationally recognized experts on educational leadership and policy</u>
- 20 <u>to:</u>
- 21 (1) assist the commissioner in effectively
- 22 researching and developing the comprehensive appraisal and
- 23 professional development system described by Subsection (a); and
- 24 (2) evaluate relevant research and practices and make

- 1 recommendations to the commissioner to improve the quality of the
- 2 training, appraisal, professional development, and compensation of
- 3 principals.
- 4 (c) If the commissioner establishes the consortium, the
- 5 commissioner shall select a presiding officer of the consortium.
- 6 The presiding officer:
- 7 (1) must be an expert on educational leadership and
- 8 policy;
- 9 (2) must have a demonstrated ability to lead a
- 10 statewide school leadership reform initiative; and
- 11 (3) may not be employed by a school district in this
- 12 state.
- 13 (d) The commissioner shall establish school leadership
- 14 standards and a set of indicators of successful school leadership
- 15 to align with the training, appraisal, and professional development
- 16 of principals.
- 17 (e) In carrying out the commissioner's powers and duties
- 18 under this section, the commissioner shall use available money from
- 19 federal, private, and any other sources that may be used for that
- 20 purpose.
- 21 (f) In appraising principals, each school district shall
- 22 use either:
- (1) the appraisal system and school leadership
- 24 standards and indicators developed or established by the
- 25 commissioner under this section; or
- 26 (2) an appraisal process and performance criteria
- 27 similar to the commissioner's appraisal system, standards, and

- 1 <u>indicators:</u>
- 2 (A) developed by the district in consultation
- 3 with the district- and campus-level committees established under
- 4 Section 11.251; and
- 5 (B) adopted by the board of trustees.
- 6 (g) Each school district shall appraise each principal
- 7 <u>annually</u>.
- 8 (h) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 9 the commissioner shall submit a written report to the governor,
- 10 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 11 presiding officer of each standing legislative committee with
- 12 primary jurisdiction over public education of:
- (1) any action taken under this section during the
- 14 preceding two years; and
- 15 (2) any recommendations for legislative action
- 16 concerning the training, appraisal, professional development, or
- 17 <u>compensation of principals.</u>
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 21.451, Education Code, is amended by
- 19 amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection
- 20 (a-1) to read as follows:
- 21 (a) The staff development provided by a school district to
- 22 an educator other than a principal must be:
- 23 (1) conducted in accordance with standards developed
- 24 by the district; and
- 25 (2) designed to improve education in the district.
- 26 (a-1) Section 21.3541 and rules adopted under that section
- 27 govern the professional development provided to a principal.

- 1 (b) The staff development <u>described by Subsection (a)</u> must
- 2 be predominantly campus-based, related to achieving campus
- 3 performance objectives established under Section 11.253, and
- 4 developed and approved by the campus-level committee established
- 5 under Section 11.251.
- 6 (c) For staff development under Subsection (a), a [A] school
- 7 district may use district-wide staff development developed and
- 8 approved through the district-level decision process under Section
- 9 11.251.
- 10 (d) The staff development:
- 11 (1) may include training in:
- 12 (A) technology;
- 13 (B) conflict resolution; and
- 14 (C) discipline strategies, including classroom
- 15 management, district discipline policies, and the student code of
- 16 conduct adopted under Section 37.001 and Chapter 37; and
- 17 (2) subject to Subsection (e) and to Section 21.3541
- 18 and rules adopted under that section, must include training based
- 19 on scientifically based research, as defined by Section 9101, No
- 20 Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (20 U.S.C. Section 7801), that:
- 21 (A) relates to instruction of students with
- 22 disabilities; and
- 23 (B) is designed for educators who work primarily
- 24 outside the area of special education.
- 25 SECTION 5. Section 21.354(e), Education Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 6. Notwithstanding Sections 21.354 and 21.451,
- 27 Education Code, as amended by this Act, until an appraisal and

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- 1 professional development system for principals under Section
- 2 21.3541, Education Code, as added by this Act, is implemented,
- 3 public school principals shall be appraised under Section 21.354,
- 4 Education Code, as that section existed before amendment by this
- 5 Act, and the staff development of principals is governed by Section
- 6 21.451, Education Code, as that section existed before amendment by
- 7 this Act.
- 8 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
