A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of certain private security companies
3	and occupations.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by amending Subdivisions (1) and (6-a) and adding Subdivisions (4),
7	(4-a), and (13-a) to read as follows:
8	(1) "Alarm system" means:
9	(A) electronic equipment and devices designed to
10	detect or signal:
11	(i) an unauthorized entry or attempted
12	entry of a person or object into a residence, business, or area
13	monitored by the system; or
14	(ii) the occurrence of a robbery or other
15	emergency; or
16	(B) electronic equipment and devices using a
17	computer or data processor designed to control the access of a
18	person, vehicle, or object through a door, gate, or entrance into
19	the controlled area of a residence or business[; or
20	(C) a television camera or still camera system
21	that:
22	[(i) records or archives images of property
23	or individuals in a public or private area of a residence or

1	(ii) is monitored by security personnel or
2	services].
3	(4) "Closed circuit television or still camera system"
4	means a device or system of devices that:
5	(A) records or transmits, including transmission
6	by an intranet or Internet device, an image or series of images;
7	(B) is monitored by security personnel or an
8	alarm systems monitor for the purposes of security or surveillance;
9	<u>and</u>
10	(C) is not used exclusively:
11	(i) to view or monitor traffic conditions
12	on public roads;
13	(ii) to detect motor vehicle violations on
14	<pre>public roads;</pre>
15	(iii) for telephone or video conferencing;
16	(iv) to monitor a manufacturing process;
17	(v) for a medical purpose by medical
18	<pre>practitioners;</pre>
19	(vi) by a courtroom reporter for recording
20	or archiving depositions or testimony;
21	(vii) in the course of an ongoing
22	investigation, when installed by and remaining under the control of
23	a licensed investigations company; or
24	(viii) by a law enforcement agency to
25	monitor criminal activity.
26	(4-a) "Camera systems company" means a person who
27	performs the activities described by Section 1702.1057.

- 1 (6-a) "Electronic access control device" means an
- 2 electronic, electrical, or computer-based device, including a
- 3 telephone entry system, that allows access to a controlled area [of
- 4 a business], but that is not monitored by security personnel or
- 5 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or
- 6 emergency services respond. The term does not include:
- 7 (A) a mechanical device, such as a deadbolt or
- 8 lock; or
- 9 (B) an operator for opening or closing a
- 10 commercial gate or door or an accessory, such as a fixed or portable
- 11 transmitter, card-reader, or keypad, if the operator or accessory
- 12 is used only to activate the gate or door and is not connected to an
- 13 alarm system.
- 14 (13-a) "Lock" means a fastening device that:
- 15 (A) is used to secure, regulate, activate, or
- 16 control a door, gate, drawer, cabinet, safe, or automobile by means
- 17 of a mechanical or electric device, including a latch, bolt, key,
- 18 transmitter, card-reader, keypad, or proximity key fob; and
- 19 (B) is not monitored by security personnel or
- 20 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or
- 21 <u>emergency services respond</u>.
- SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 1702.021, Occupations
- 23 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) The Texas Private Security Board consists of <u>nine</u>
- 25 [seven] members appointed by the governor with the advice and
- 26 consent of the senate as follows:
- 27 (1) five [four] public members, each of whom is a

- 1 citizen of the United States;
- 2 (2) one member who is licensed under this chapter as a
- 3 private investigator;
- 4 (3) one member who is licensed under this chapter as an
- 5 alarm systems company; [and]
- 6 (4) one member who is licensed under this chapter as
- 7 the owner or operator of a guard company; and
- 8 (5) one member who is licensed under this chapter as a
- 9 locksmith.
- 10 SECTION 3. Subsection (a), Section 1702.102, Occupations
- 11 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) Unless the person holds a license as a security services
- 13 contractor, a person may not:
- 14 (1) act as an alarm systems company, armored car
- 15 company, camera systems company, courier company, guard company,
- 16 guard dog company, locksmith company, or private security
- 17 consultant company;
- 18 (2) offer to perform the services of a company in
- 19 Subdivision (1); or
- 20 (3) engage in business activity for which a license is
- 21 required under this chapter.
- SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 1702.1056, Occupations
- 23 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) A person acts as a locksmith company for the purposes of
- 25 this chapter if the person:
- 26 (1) for a fee and with legal authorization, sells,
- 27 installs, services, [ex] maintains, bypasses, or defeats

- 1 electronic access control devices or [offers to sell, install,
- 2 service, or maintain, mechanical security devices, including
- 3 deadbolts and locks;
- 4 (2) advertises services $\underline{\text{traditionally}}$ offered by $\underline{\text{a}}$
- 5 [the] company using the term "locksmith"; or
- 6 (3) includes the term "locksmith" in the company's
- 7 name.
- 8 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 1702.1057 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 1702.1057. CAMERA SYSTEMS COMPANY. A person acts as a
- 11 <u>camera systems company for purposes of this chapter if the person:</u>
- 12 <u>(1)</u> sells, installs, services, or monitors a closed
- 13 circuit television or still camera system; or
- 14 (2) offers to perform a service described by
- 15 Subdivision (1).
- SECTION 6. Subsection (b), Section 1702.221, Occupations
- 17 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 18 (b) An individual must obtain the appropriate endorsement
- 19 in accordance with the requirements of this chapter and related
- 20 administrative rules if the individual:
- 21 (1) is employed as:
- 22 (A) an alarm instructor;
- 23 (B) an alarm systems installer;
- 24 (C) an alarm systems monitor;
- (D) an electronic access control device
- 26 installer;
- 27 (E) a level 3 classroom or firearm instructor;

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- 13 (2) is an owner who oversees the security-related 14 aspects of the business, officer, partner, or shareholder of a 15 license holder.
- SECTION 7. Subsection (a), Section 1702.2227, Occupations
 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) An individual acts as a locksmith for the purposes of 19 this chapter if the person:
- 20 (1) for a fee and with legal authorization, sells,
- 21 installs, services, [ex] maintains, bypasses, or defeats
- 22 <u>electronic access control devices or</u> mechanical security devices,
- 23 including deadbolts and locks; or
- 24 (2) advertises or offers <u>locksmith</u> services to the
- 25 public or represents to the public that the person is a locksmith.
- SECTION 8. Subchapter J, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Section 1702.2228 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 1702.2228. CAMERA SYSTEMS INSTALLER. An individual
- 2 acts as a camera systems installer for purposes of this chapter if
- 3 the individual:
- 4 (1) installs, maintains, or repairs a closed circuit
- 5 television or still camera system; or
- 6 (2) advertises or offers the services under
- 7 Subdivision (1) to the public or represents to the public that the
- 8 person is a camera systems installer.
- 9 SECTION 9. Subsection (a), Section 1702.224, Occupations
- 10 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) An individual acts as an alarm systems monitor for
- 12 purposes of this chapter if the individual monitors an alarm
- 13 system, camera system, or detection device.
- 14 SECTION 10. Section 1702.288, Occupations Code, is amended
- 15 by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 16 (f) A license holder acting as an alarm systems company does
- 17 not have to provide the notice required under Subsection (d) if the
- 18 contact information, including the address and the telephone
- 19 numbers for the alarm company, has not changed.
- 20 SECTION 11. Section 1702.322, Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.322. LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL. This chapter
- 23 does not apply to:
- 24 (1) a person who has full-time employment as a peace
- 25 officer and who receives compensation for private employment on an
- 26 individual or an independent contractor basis as a patrolman,
- 27 guard, extra job coordinator, or watchman if the officer:

- 1 (A) is employed in an employee-employer
- 2 relationship or employed on an individual contractual basis:
- 3 (i) directly by the recipient of the
- 4 services; or
- 5 <u>(ii)</u> by a company licensed under this
- 6 chapter;
- 7 (B) is not in the employ of another peace
- 8 officer;
- 9 (C) is not a reserve peace officer; and
- 10 (D) works as a peace officer on the average of at
- 11 least 32 hours a week, is compensated by the state or a political
- 12 subdivision of the state at least at the minimum wage, and is
- 13 entitled to all employee benefits offered to a peace officer by the
- 14 state or political subdivision;
- 15 (2) a reserve peace officer while the reserve officer
- 16 is performing guard, patrolman, or watchman duties for a county and
- 17 is being compensated solely by that county;
- 18 (3) a peace officer acting in an official capacity in
- 19 responding to a burglar alarm or detection device; or
- 20 (4) a person engaged in the business of electronic
- 21 monitoring of an individual as a condition of that individual's
- 22 community supervision, parole, mandatory supervision, or release
- 23 on bail, if the person does not perform any other service that
- 24 requires a license under this chapter.
- 25 SECTION 12. Section 1702.328, Occupations Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.328. SECURITY SYSTEMS SALES AND INSTALLATION

- 1 EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to:
- 2 (1) a person who owns and installs <u>an alarm system or</u>
- 3 [a burglar] detection [or alarm] device, electronic access control
- 4 device, lock, or closed circuit television or still camera system
- 5 on the person's own property or[, if the person does not charge for
- 6 the device or the installation, installs the system or device for
- 7 the protection of the person's personal property located on another
- 8 person's property and does not, as a normal business practice,
- 9 install the <u>systems or</u> devices on the property of another, and who
- 10 does not perform any other act that requires a license under this
- 11 chapter;
- 12 (2) a person in the business of building construction
- 13 that installs electrical wiring and devices that may include in
- 14 part the installation of \underline{an} [a burglar] alarm $\underline{system}_{\bullet}$ [\underline{or}]
- 15 detection device, electronic access control device, lock, or closed
- 16 <u>circuit television or still camera system</u> if:
- 17 (A) the person is a party to a contract that
- 18 provides that:
- 19 (i) the installation will be performed,
- 20 [under the direct supervision of, and] inspected, and certified
- 21 by $[\tau]$ a person licensed to install and certify the alarm system,
- 22 [or] detection device, electronic access control device, lock, or
- 23 closed circuit television or still camera system; and
- (ii) the license holder assumes full
- 25 responsibility for the installation of the system [alarm] or
- 26 [detection] device; and
- 27 (B) the person does not service or maintain alarm

- 1 systems, electronic access control devices, locks, closed circuit
- 2 <u>television or still camera systems</u>, or detection devices;
- 3 (3) a person who sells or installs automobile burglar
- 4 alarm devices and who does not perform any other act that requires a
- 5 license under this chapter; or
- 6 (4) a person who sells exclusively by e-commerce, over
- 7 the counter transactions, or mail order, alarm systems, electronic
- 8 access control devices, locks, or detection devices and who does
- 9 not perform any other act that requires a license under this
- 10 chapter.
- 11 SECTION 13. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to
- 12 Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, apply only to an application for an
- 13 original or renewal license, registration, or endorsement
- 14 submitted to the Texas Private Security Board on or after January 1,
- 15 2012. An application submitted before January 1, 2012, is governed
- 16 by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and
- 17 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 18 (b) Not later than February 1, 2013, the governor shall
- 19 appoint the members of the Texas Private Security Board necessary
- 20 to ensure the composition of the board complies with Section
- 21 1702.021, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- (c) The Texas Private Security Board shall adopt rules to
- 23 implement the changes in law made by this Act not later than January
- 24 1, 2012. A person is not required to obtain a registration or
- 25 endorsement under Section 1702.2228, Occupations Code, as added by
- 26 this Act, before January 1, 2012.
- 27 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect immediately if it

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- 1 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 2 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 3 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 4 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
