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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of certain private security companies 3 and occupations. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subdivisions (1) and (6-a) and adding Subdivisions (4), 6 (4-a), and (13-a) to read as follows: 7 (1) "Alarm system" means: 8 electronic equipment and devices designed to 9 (A) 10 detect or signal: 11 (i) an unauthorized entry or attempted entry of a person or object into a residence, business, or area 12 monitored by the system; or 13 14 (ii) the occurrence of a robbery or other 15 emergency; or electronic equipment and devices using a 16 (B) computer or data processor designed to control the access of a 17 person, vehicle, or object through a door, gate, or entrance into 18 the controlled area of a residence or business [; or 19 20 [(C) a television camera or still camera system 21 that: 22 [(i) records or archives images of property 23 individuals in a public or private area of a residence or 24 business; or

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1	[(ii) is monitored by security personnel or
2	services].
3	(4) "Closed circuit television or still camera system"
4	means a device or system of devices that:
5	(A) records or transmits, including transmission
6	by an intranet or Internet device, an image or series of images;
7	(B) is monitored by security personnel for the
8	purposes of security or surveillance; and
9	(C) is not used exclusively:
10	(i) to view or monitor traffic conditions
11	on public roads;
12	(ii) to detect motor vehicle violations on
13	<pre>public roads;</pre>
14	(iii) for telephone or video conferencing;
15	(iv) to monitor a manufacturing process;
16	(v) for a medical purpose by medical
17	<pre>practitioners;</pre>
18	(vi) by a courtroom reporter for recording
19	or archiving depositions or testimony;
20	(vii) in the course of an ongoing
21	investigation, when installed by and remaining under the control of
22	a licensed investigations company; or
23	(viii) by a law enforcement agency to
24	monitor criminal activity.
25	(4-a) "Camera systems company" means a person who
26	performs the activities described by Section 1702.1057.
27	(6-a) "Electronic access control device" means an

No. 1400 1 electronic, electrical, or computer-based device, including a 2 telephone entry system, that allows access to a controlled area [of 3 a business], but that is not monitored by security personnel or 4 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or 5 emergency services respond. The term does not include: 6 (A) a mechanical device, such as a deadbolt or

8 (B) an operator for opening or closing a 9 commercial gate or door or an accessory, such as a fixed or portable 10 transmitter, card-reader, or keypad, if the operator or accessory 11 is used only to activate the gate or door and is not connected to an 12 alarm system.

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lock; or

13 (13-a) "Lock" means a fastening device that: (A) is used to secure, regulate, activate, or 15 control a door, gate, drawer, cabinet, safe, or automobile by means 16 of a mechanical or electric device, including a latch, bolt, key, 17 transmitter, card-reader, keypad, or proximity key fob; and 18 (B) is not monitored by security personnel or 19 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or

19 services and does not send a signal to which law enforcement or 20 emergency services respond.

21 SECTION 2. Section 1702.021(a), Occupations Code, is 22 amended to read as follows:

(a) The Texas Private Security Board consists of <u>nine</u>
[seven] members appointed by the governor with the advice and
consent of the senate as follows:

(1) <u>five</u> [four] public members, each of whom is a
 citizen of the United States;

Section 1702.102(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 10 (a) Unless the person holds a license as a security services 11 12 contractor, a person may not: (1) act as an alarm systems company, armored car 13 14 company, camera systems company, courier company, guard company, 15 guard dog company, locksmith company, or private security 16 consultant company; 17 (2) offer to perform the services of a company in Subdivision (1); or 18 engage in business activity for which a license is 19 (3) required under this chapter. 20 21 SECTION 4. Section 1702.1056(a), Occupations Code, is 22 amended to read as follows: 23 A person acts as a locksmith company for the purposes of (a) 24 this chapter if the person: 25 (1)for a fee and with legal authorization, sells, 26 installs, services, [or] maintains, <u>bypasses, or defeats</u>

27 <u>electronic access control devices</u> or [offers to sell, install,

No. 1400 service, or maintain, mechanical security devices, including 1 deadbolts and locks; 2 3 (2) advertises services traditionally offered by a [the] company using the term "locksmith"; or 4 5 (3) includes the term "locksmith" in the company's 6 name. 7 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 1702.1057 to read as follows: 8 9 Sec. 1702.1057. CAMERA SYSTEMS COMPANY. A person acts as a 10 camera systems company for purposes of this chapter if the person: (1) sells, installs, services, or monitors a closed 11 circuit television or still camera system; or 12 (2) offers to perform a service described 13 by 14 Subdivision (1). 1702.221(b), Occupations Code, 15 SECTION 6. Section is amended to read as follows: 16 17 (b) An individual must obtain the appropriate endorsement in accordance with the requirements of this chapter and related 18 administrative rules if the individual: 19 20 is employed as: (1) 21 (A) an alarm instructor; an alarm systems installer; 2.2 (B) 23 (C) an alarm systems monitor; 24 (D) an electronic access control device 25 installer; a level 3 classroom or firearm instructor; 26 (E) 27 (F) a locksmith;

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1 (G) a dog trainer; (H) a manager or branch office manager; 2 3 (I) a noncommissioned security officer; (J) a level 4 personal protection instructor; 4 a private investigator; 5 (K) (L) a private security consultant; 6 7 a security salesperson; [or] (M) 8 (N) a camera systems installer; or individual include 9 (0) an whose duties 10 performing another activity for which an endorsement is required under Subsection (e); or 11 is an owner who oversees the security-related 12 (2) aspects of the business, officer, partner, or shareholder of a 13 14 license holder. 15 SECTION 7. Section 1702.2227(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 16 17 (a) An individual acts as a locksmith for the purposes of this chapter if the person: 18 19 (1) for a fee and with legal authorization, sells, installs, services, [or] maintains, bypasses, or defeats 20 electronic access control devices or mechanical security devices, 21 including deadbolts and locks; or 22 (2) advertises or offers locksmith services to the 23 24 public or represents to the public that the person is a locksmith. 25 SECTION 8. Subchapter J, Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 1702.2228 to read as follows: 26 27 Sec. 1702.2228. CAMERA SYSTEMS INSTALLER. An individual

2	the individual:
3	(1) installs, maintains, or repairs a closed circuit
4	television or still camera system; or
5	(2) advertises or offers the services under
6	Subdivision (1) to the public or represents to the public that the

8	SECTION 9. Section 1702.288, Occupations Code, is amended
9	by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
10	(f) A license holder acting as an alarm systems company does
11	not have to provide the notice required under Subsection (d) if the
12	contact information, including the address and the telephone
13	numbers for the alarm company, has not changed.
14	SECTION 10. Section 1702.328, Occupations Code, is amended
15	to read as follows:
16	Sec. 1702.328. SECURITY SYSTEMS SALES AND INSTALLATION
17	EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to:
18	(1) a person who owns and installs <u>an alarm system or</u>
19	[a burglar] detection [or alarm] device <u>, electronic access control</u>
20	device, lock, or closed circuit television or still camera system
21	on the person's own property or[, if the person does not charge for
22	the device or the installation,] installs the system or device for
23	the protection of the person's personal property located on another
24	person's property and does not, as a normal business practice,
25	install the <u>systems or</u> devices on the property of another <u>, and who</u>
26	does not perform any other act that requires a license under this
27	<pre>chapter;</pre>

No. 1400 1 (2) a person in the business of building construction that installs electrical wiring and devices that may include in 2 3 part the installation of <u>an</u> [a burglar] alarm system, [or] detection device, electronic access control device, lock, or closed 4 circuit television or still camera system if: 5 6 (A) the person is a party to a contract that 7 provides that: 8 (i) the installation will be performed, [under the direct supervision of, and] inspected, and certified 9 10 by $[\tau]$ a person licensed to install and certify the alarm system, [or] detection device, electronic access control device, lock, or 11 12 closed circuit television or still camera system; and license 13 (ii) the holder assumes full 14 responsibility for the installation of the system [alarm] or 15 [detection] device; and (B) the person does not service or maintain alarm 16 17 systems, electronic access control devices, locks, closed circuit television or still camera systems, or detection devices; 18 19 (3) a person who sells or installs automobile burglar 20 alarm devices and who does not perform any other act that requires a license under this chapter; or 21 (4) a person who sells exclusively by e-commerce, over 22 the counter transactions, or mail order, alarm systems, electronic 23 access control devices, locks, or detection devices and who does 24 not perform any other act that requires a license under this 25 26 chapter. SECTION 11. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to 27

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1 Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, apply only to an application for an original renewal license, registration, 2 or or endorsement 3 submitted to the Texas Private Security Board on or after January 1, 2012. An application submitted before January 1, 2012, is governed 4 5 by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 6

7 (b) Not later than February 1, 2013, the governor shall 8 appoint the members of the Texas Private Security Board necessary 9 to ensure the composition of the board complies with Section 10 1702.021, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

(c) The Texas Private Security Board shall adopt rules to implement the changes in law made by this Act not later than January 1, 2012. A person is not required to obtain a registration or endorsement under Section 1702.2228, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, before January 1, 2012.

16 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect immediately if it 17 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 18 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 19 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 20 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
