A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to certain low-income weatherization programs.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subsection (f), Section 39.905, Utilities Code,
- 5 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Unless funding is provided under Section 39.903, each unbundled transmission and distribution utility shall include in 7 8 its energy efficiency plan a targeted low-income energy efficiency program as described by Section 39.903(f)(2), and the savings 9 achieved by the program shall count toward the transmission and 10 distribution utility's energy efficiency goal. 11 The commission 12 shall determine the appropriate level of funding to be allocated to 13 both targeted and standard offer low-income energy efficiency programs in each unbundled transmission and distribution utility 14 The <u>level</u> of funding for low-income energy 15 service area. efficiency programs shall be provided from money approved by the 16 17 commission for the transmission and distribution utility's energy efficiency programs. The commission shall ensure that annual 18 [total] expenditures for the [both] targeted [and standard offer] 19 low-income efficiency programs 20 energy of each unbundled 21 transmission and distribution utility are not less than 10 percent 22 of the transmission and distribution utility's energy efficiency budget for the year. A targeted low-income energy efficiency 23 24 program must comply with the same audit requirements that apply to

federal weatherization subrecipients [will be based on the amount 1 spent by the transmission and distribution utility on the 2 commission's hard to reach program in calendar year 2003]. 3 energy efficiency cost recovery factor proceeding related to 4 expenditures under this subsection, the commission shall make 5 findings of fact regarding whether the utility meets requirements 6 7 imposed under this subsection [This level of funding for low-income energy efficiency programs shall be provided from money approved by 8 9 the commission for the transmission and distribution utility's energy efficiency programs]. The state agency that administers the 10 11 federal weatherization assistance program shall provide reports as required by the commission to provide the most current information 12 13 available on energy and peak demand savings achieved in each transmission and distribution utility service area. 14 The agency 15 shall participate in energy efficiency cost recovery factor 16 proceedings related to expenditures under this subsection to ensure that targeted low-income weatherization programs are consistent 17 with federal weatherization programs and adequately funded. 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

23 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
