A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the coordinated dissemination of online information regarding the operation and performance of certain for-profit 3 educational entities. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 61.0778 to read as follows: Sec. 61.0778. ONLINE INFORMATION REGARDING CERTAIN 8 9 FOR-PROFIT EDUCATIONAL ENTITIES. (a) In this section, "commission" means the Texas Workforce Commission. 10 (b) The board and commission jointly shall develop a 11 12 comprehensive strategy to improve and coordinate the dissemination of online information regarding the operation and performance of 13 14 for-profit private postsecondary educational institutions and for-profit career schools or colleges in this state. As part of the 15 comprehensive strategy, the board and the commission shall compile, 16 share, and compare any applicable information under the control of 17 each agency and shall organize that information as nearly as 18 possible according to the categories of information required for 19 the online resumes of general academic teaching institutions under 20 Section 51A.103. 21 (c) For each for-profit private postsecondary educational 22 23 institution or for-profit career school or college that the board

24 or commission identifies as doing business in this state, the board

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1 and commission shall each publish on the agency's Internet website any information described by Subsection (b) that the board and 2 commission jointly determine would assist a person in deciding 3 whether to enroll in the institution, school, or college or in 4 5 identifying or choosing which institution, school, or college to attend. The websites must: 6 7 (1) present information regarding those institutions, 8 schools, and colleges in a manner that is: 9 (A) to the extent practicable, consistent among the institutions, schools, and colleges; and 10 11 (B) easily accessible and readily understandable 12 to the public; and (2) allow for interactive online reporting of 13 14 complaints from the public about a specific institution, school, or 15 college. (d) The board and commission shall each refer any complaint 16 17 the agency receives under Subsection (c)(2) regarding the operation and performance of a for-profit private postsecondary educational 18 19 institution or for-profit career school or college to the consumer protection division of the attorney general's office for timely 20 investigation and resolution of the complaint. 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 22

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
