A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the preparation, certification and working conditions
 3 of educators.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.044, Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 21.044. EDUCATOR PREPARATION. (a) The board shall
- 8 propose rules establishing the training requirements a person must
- 9 accomplish to obtain a certificate, enter an internship, or enter
- 10 an induction-year program. The board shall specify the minimum
- 11 academic qualifications required for a certificate.
- 12 (b) A person may not be admitted to an educator preparation
- 13 program, including an undergraduate university program,
- 14 alternative certification program, or postbaccalaureate program,
- 15 unless the person:

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- 16 (1) has an overall grade point average of at least 2.75
- 17 on a four-point scale or the equivalent;
- 18 (2) demonstrates, in the manner determined by the
- 19 board, basic skills in reading, writing, and mathematics; and
- 20 (3) has successfully completed a minimum of 18
- 21 semester credit hours in the subject-specific content area for the
- 22 certification sought, a passing score on a content certification
- 23 examination, or a passing score on a content examination
- 24 administered by a vendor on the Texas Education Agency (TEA) -

- 1 approved vendor list published by the commissioner of education for
- 2 the calendar year during which the person seeks admission.
- 3 (c) The requirement in Subsection (b)(3) applies only to a
- 4 person seeking an initial certificate.
- 5 (d) An educator preparation program may admit a person to
- 6 the program who does not have at least the grade point average
- 7 required by Subsection (b)(1) if the person's work, business, or
- 8 career experience demonstrates achievement. The person must submit
- 9 satisfactory documentation regarding the person's experience to
- 10 the program director, and the program must maintain the
- 11 documentation and make it available to the board on request. The
- 12 number of persons admitted under this subsection in an academic
- 13 year may not exceed five percent of the total number of program
- 14 candidates admitted to the program in that year.
- 15 (e) An educator preparation program may not recommend any
- 16 person for a standard classroom teacher certificates, including
- 17 special education certificates, career and technical education
- 18 certificates, and endorsement areas, unless the person has
- 19 <u>maintained an overall grade point average of at least 2.75 on a</u>
- 20 four-point scale or the equivalent while enrolled in the program.
- 21 An educator preparation program may waive this requirement only in
- 22 <u>extraordinary circumstances and for no more than five percent of</u>
- 23 the cohort of candidates recommended by the program for
- 24 certification in that year.
- 25 (f) An educator preparation program may impose requirements
- 26 <u>in addition to the requirements imposed under this section.</u>
- 27 (g) The board shall propose rules to implement this Section.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 21.048(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 21.048. CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS. (a) The board
- 4 shall propose rules prescribing comprehensive examinations for
- 5 each class of certificate issued by the board. The board shall
- 6 determine the satisfactory level of performance required for each
- 7 <u>certification examination</u>. For the issuance of a generalist or
- 8 multi-subject certificate, the board shall require satisfactory
- 9 performance in each of subject areas of English Language Arts and
- 10 Reading, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies
- 11 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 21.008 to read as follows:
- Sec. 21.008. BIENNIAL REPORT ON EDUCATORS. (a) Not later
- 14 than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the agency shall
- 15 prepare, publish, and submit to the legislature a report regarding
- 16 public school staffing and the working conditions for public school
- 17 <u>educators.</u> The report also shall be posted on the agency's Website.
- 18 (b) The report must contain staffing information for each
- 19 campus, including at least the following:
- (1) the percentage of teachers assigned to teach
- 21 subjects outside their areas of expertise or certification;
- (2) the percentage of teachers employed under
- 23 <u>emergency certificates;</u>
- 24 (3) teacher turnover rates; and
- 25 (4) the number and percentage of teachers who have
- 26 less than one year of experience as a teacher.
- 27 (c) The report must contain information regarding working

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- 1 conditions in each district based on a statewide survey conducted
- 2 by the agency of certified educators. To encourage the uninhibited
- 3 participation of educators, the survey should be designed to
- 4 prevent the disclosure of the identities of individual respondents
- 5 in the report. Based upon the results of the survey, the agency
- 6 should include recommendations to for improving the working
- 7 conditions at schools identified as having poor working conditions.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 21.044(b)-(e), Education Code, as added
- 9 by this Act, applies only to a person who is admitted to an educator
- 10 preparation program on or after January 1, 2012.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
