- 2 relating to the sterilization of dogs and cats; providing a
- 3 penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 828, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 828. DOG AND CAT <u>ADOPTION AND</u> STERILIZATION
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 828.001, Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivisions (1-a)
- 10 and (3-a) to read as follows:
- 11 (1) "Microchip" means a transponder injected beneath
- 12 the surface of an animal's skin that can be read by a microchip
- 13 <u>scanner.</u>
- 14 (1-a) "New owner" means a person who is legally
- 15 competent to enter into a binding contract and who is adopting a dog
- 16 or cat from a releasing agency.
- 17 (3-a) "Tattoo" means an indelible mark or figure on
- 18 the body of an animal produced by inserting a pigment under the skin
- 19 of the animal.
- SECTION 3. Section 828.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 828.002. STERILIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR RELEASE OF
- 23 ANIMAL BY RELEASING AGENCY [ADOPTION]. (a) Except as provided by
- 24 Subsections (b) and (c) [Section 828.013], a releasing agency may

- 1 not release a dog or cat to a new owner for adoption or to a person
- 2 who already owns the dog or cat unless the animal has been
- 3 sterilized [or the release is made to a new owner who signs an
- 4 agreement to have the animal sterilized].
- 5 (b) This section does not apply to an animal released for
- 6 adoption to a new owner if the animal:
- 7 (1) is less than six months old;
- 8 <u>(2) is an animal that a veterinarian has certified</u>
- 9 should not be sterilized for health reasons; or
- 10 <u>(3)</u> is a service animal.
- 11 (c) This section does not apply to an animal that is claimed
- 12 from a releasing agency by a person who already owns the animal if:
- 13 (1) the animal is exempt from sterilization under
- 14 Section 830.002(b); and
- 15 (2) the owner holds a permit for the animal issued
- 16 <u>under Section 830.003.</u>
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 828.0035, Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 828.0035. STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINERS;
- 20 <u>IDENTIFICATION MARKERS</u>. (a) The State Board of Veterinary Medical
- 21 Examiners shall:
- 22 (1) develop information sheets regarding surgical or
- 23 nonsurgical sterilization to be distributed by a releasing agency
- 24 to a new owner; and
- 25 (2) adopt rules requiring an animal that has been
- 26 sterilized under this chapter or Chapter 830 to receive a tattoo or
- 27 a microchip as a permanent [an] identification marker [in a manner

- 1 authorized by the board].
- 2 (b) The rules adopted under Subsection (a)(2) must require a
- 3 tattoo to:
- 4 (1) be located on the inside of the thigh, near the
- 5 abdomen, or on the caudal ventral abdomen of the animal;
- 6 (2) use pigment that is manufactured in the United
- 7 States;
- 8 (3) comply with the standards adopted by the United
- 9 States Food and Drug Administration for tattoos;
- 10 (4) use a pigment color that contrasts with the
- 11 predominant color of the skin of the animal; and
- 12 (5) consist of the universal symbol for a male or
- 13 female with a line drawn across the circle included in the symbol.
- 14 (c) The owner of a sterilized animal that has been injected
- 15 with a microchip as authorized by Subsection (a)(2) shall provide
- 16 information to the manufacturer of the microchip indicating that
- 17 the animal is sterilized.
- SECTION 5. Section 828.012(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) <u>Surgical</u> [Surgery] or nonsurgical sterilization <u>of a</u>
- 21 dog or cat [performed in accordance with this chapter] must be
- 22 performed by a veterinarian or a full-time student of an accredited
- 23 college of veterinary medicine as provided by Chapter 801,
- 24 Occupations Code.
- 25 SECTION 6. Chapter 828, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 26 by adding Section 828.016 to read as follows:
- Sec. 828.016. LOCAL REGULATION OF STERILIZATION. A county

- 1 or municipality may adopt additional sterilization requirements if
- 2 the requirements are more stringent than the requirements provided
- 3 by this chapter.
- 4 SECTION 7. Title 10, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Chapter 830 to read as follows:
- 6 CHAPTER 830. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITY OF DOG OR CAT OWNER TO
- 7 <u>STERILIZE</u>
- 8 Sec. 830.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 9 (1) "Sterilization" means the surgical removal of the
- 10 reproductive organs of a dog or cat or the use of nonsurgical
- 11 methods and technologies approved by the United States Food and
- 12 Drug Administration or the United States Department of Agriculture
- 13 to permanently render the animal unable to reproduce.
- 14 (2) "Veterinarian" means a person licensed to practice
- 15 veterinary medicine by the State Board of Veterinary Medical
- 16 Examiners.
- 17 Sec. 830.002. STERILIZATION REQUIRED. (a) Except as
- 18 provided by Subsection (b), a person who owns a dog or cat shall
- 19 have the animal sterilized and comply with the rules adopted under
- 20 Section 828.0035(a)(2).
- 21 (b) This section does not apply to an animal:
- 22 (1) that is less than six months old;
- 23 (2) for which a veterinarian has certified that the
- 24 animal should not be sterilized for health reasons;
- 25 (3) that is a service animal;
- 26 (4) that is a purebred animal displayed at a
- 27 competitive exhibition to determine how well it physically conforms

- 1 to an established breed standard;
- 2 (5) that the owner keeps unsterilized for breeding
- 3 purposes; or
- 4 (6) that is a dog used for lawful hunting activities by
- 5 <u>an owner who holds a valid hunting license issued by this state.</u>
- 6 Sec. 830.003. INTACT ANIMAL PERMIT. (a) A person must hold
- 7 <u>an intact animal permit issued by the appropriate local animal</u>
- 8 control authority for each dog or cat the person keeps
- 9 unsterilized.
- 10 (b) An intact animal permit is valid for a period of one year
- 11 and may be renewed on payment of an annual renewal fee.
- 12 (c) An animal control authority shall charge a fee for the
- 13 issuance or renewal of a permit under this section in the amount of
- 14 \$50 for each dog or cat.
- Sec. 830.004. CRIMINAL PENALTY. A person who violates
- 16 Section 830.002 commits a Class C misdemeanor. Each animal that a
- 17 person owns in violation of that section is a separate offense.
- 18 Sec. 830.005. LOCAL REGULATION OF STERILIZATION. A county
- 19 or municipality may adopt additional sterilization requirements if
- 20 the requirements are more stringent than the requirements provided
- 21 by this chapter.
- 22 SECTION 8. Sections 828.003, 828.004, 828.005, 828.006,
- 23 828.007, 828.008, 828.009, 828.010, 828.013, and 828.015, Health
- 24 and Safety Code, are repealed.
- 25 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
