Sec. 434.156. REGIONAL VETERANS RESOURCE COUNSELORS. The commission shall employ a regional veterans resource (a) counselor for each education region to oversee the veterans resource center or centers located in the region.

(b) A regional veterans resource counselor shall maintain an office at a veterans resource center at an institution of higher education located in the region served by the veterans resource counselor.

(c) Each regional veterans resource counselor shall:

(1) visit the institutions of higher education located in the education region served by the veterans resource counselor;
(2) work with those institutions of higher education

to:

(A) hospitable create and supportive

environment for veterans;

(B) enhance awareness of and encourage in veterans educational programs and participation commission programs providing other services to veterans, including employment and claims assistance services;
