SYSTEM HEALTH CENTERS 1-16 51.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: Sec. (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher 1-17 Education Coordinating Board. (2) "General academic teaching institution, "governing board," "institution of higher education," an "university system" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003. 1-18 1-19 1-20 institution," and 1-21 Sec. 51.452. SYSTEM HEALTH CENTER. A system health center 1-22 integrates biomedical and clinical research, patient care services, and predoctoral and postdoctoral teaching provided by 1-23 1**-**24 1**-**25 participating institutions, schools, and programs. Sec. 51.453. ESTABLISHMENT. (a) The governing board of a 1-26 1-27 university system may establish a system health center consisting of institutions of higher education under the board's control and direction if the system meets the criteria provided by this subchapter, as determined by the coordinating board. (b) The educational programs of a system health center must 1-28 1-29 1-30 1-31 offered primarily by a single institution of higher education 1-32 and, together with patient care services, must be provided primarily within the geographic region designated by the governing 1-33 1-34 1-35 board. For purposes of the appropriation formulas recommended by the coordinating board under 2-19 2-20 2-21 2-22 Section 61.059, a student of an educational program offered by a system health center is considered to be a student of a 2-23 health-related institution to the extent that formula funding of 2-24 health-related institutions applies to the discipline in which student is enrolled. 2-25 the 2-26 2-27 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-28 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-29 2-30 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-31 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
