- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 411.0094 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 411.0094. AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE READER PILOT
- 8 PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "automatic license plate reader"
- 9 means a system that reads and records license plate numbers taken
- 10 from digital photographs.
- 11 (b) The department shall establish a pilot program in which
- 12 automatic license plate readers may be installed in law enforcement
- 13 motor vehicles used by the department for law enforcement.
- 14 (c) The program must include a request for proposal process
- 15 to select a contractor for the installation of automatic license
- 16 plate readers.
- 17 (d) The department shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 18 implement the program.
- 19 <u>(e) An automatic license plate reader installed under this</u>
- 20 <u>section:</u>

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program.

- 21 (1) may be used only to record information necessary
- 22 to identify a motor vehicle; and
- 23 (2) may not be used to record an image of a person in a
- 24 motor vehicle.

- 1 (f) The images and any related data produced from an
- 2 automatic license plate identification camera system can be queried
- 3 or disseminated only for a law enforcement purpose.
- 4 (g) All data produced from an automatic license plate reader
- 5 shall be destroyed within one year of collection unless the data is
- 6 evidence in a criminal investigation or prosecution.
- 7 (h) Any agreement or memorandum of understanding concerning
- 8 data-sharing related to an automatic license plate identification
- 9 camera system between law enforcement entities collecting,
- 10 sharing, or gaining access to data under this section is subject to
- 11 the provisions of Chapter 552.
- 12 (i) Not later than December 1, 2012, the department shall
- 13 file a report with the committee in each house of the legislature
- 14 having primary jurisdiction over homeland security matters. The
- 15 report must include:
- 16 (1) information regarding the use of automatic license
- 17 plate readers by the department; and
- 18 (2) any other information that would assist the
- 19 legislature in evaluating the effectiveness of the use of automatic
- 20 license plate readers by the department.
- 21 (j) This section expires September 1, 2013.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
