5 SECTION 1. Section 411.023, Government Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (g) to read as 7 follows:

A special ranger is subject to the orders of the 8 (b) commission and the governor for special duty to the same extent as 9 other law enforcement officers provided for by this chapter, except 10 that a special ranger may not enforce a law [except one designed to 11 12 protect life and property and may not enforce a law] regulating the 13 use of a state highway by a motor vehicle. A special ranger is not connected with a ranger company or uniformed unit of the 14 15 department.

17		(1) preserve the peace and protect life and property;
18		(2) conduct background investigations;
