A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to conditions on the receipt of tuition and fee exemptions
3	at public institutions of higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 54.2001 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.2001. CONTINUED RECEIPT OF EXEMPTIONS CONDITIONAL.
8	(a) Notwithstanding any other law but subject to Subsection (f),
9	after initially qualifying under this subchapter for a mandatory or
10	discretionary exemption from the payment of tuition or other fees
11	for enrollment during a semester or term at an institution of higher
12	education, a person may continue to receive the exemption for a
13	subsequent semester or term only if the person:
14	(1) maintains a grade point average that satisfies the
15	institution's grade point average requirement for making
16	satisfactory academic progress toward a degree or a certificate in
17	accordance with the institution's policy regarding eligibility for
18	financial aid; and
19	(2) as of the beginning of the semester or term, has
20	not completed more than 30 semester credit hours, or a greater
21	number of hours as permitted by the institution on a showing of good
22	cause, in excess of the minimum number of semester credit hours
23	required to complete the person's degree or certificate program.
24	(b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(2), the computation of a

- 1 person's total number of completed semester credit hours includes
- 2 transfer credit hours that count toward the person's degree or
- 3 certificate program course requirements, but excludes:
- 4 (1) hours earned exclusively by examination;
- 5 (2) hours earned for a course for which the person
- 6 <u>received credit toward the person's high school academic</u>
- 7 requirements; and
- 8 (3) hours earned for developmental coursework that an
- 9 institution of higher education required the person to take under
- 10 Section 51.3062 or under the former provisions of Section 51.306.
- 11 <u>(c) If on the completion of any semester or term a person</u>
- 12 <u>fails to meet any requirement of Subsection (a)</u>, the person may not
- 13 receive an exemption from the payment of tuition or other fees
- 14 described by Subsection (a) for the next semester or term in which
- 15 the person enrolls. A person may become eligible to receive an
- 16 exemption in a subsequent semester or term if the person:
- 17 (1) completes a semester or term during which the
- 18 person is not eligible for an exemption; and
- 19 (2) meets each requirement of Subsection (a).
- 20 (d) Each institution of higher education shall adopt a
- 21 policy to allow a student who fails to maintain a grade point
- 22 average as required by Subsection (a)(1) to receive an exemption in
- 23 any semester or term on a showing of hardship or other good cause,
- 24 including:
- 25 (1) a showing of a severe illness or other
- 26 debilitating condition that could affect the student's academic
- 27 performance;

- 1 (2) an indication that the student is responsible for
- 2 the care of a sick, injured, or needy person and that the student's
- 3 provision of care could affect the student's academic performance;
- 4 (3) the student's active duty or other service in the
- 5 United States armed forces; or
- 6 (4) any other cause considered acceptable by the
- 7 institution.
- 8 <u>(e) An institution of higher education shall maintain</u>
- 9 documentation of each exception granted to a student under
- 10 Subsection (d).
- 11 (f) If a requirement imposed by this section for the
- 12 continued receipt of a specific exemption conflicts with another
- 13 requirement imposed by statute for that exemption, the stricter
- 14 requirement prevails.
- 15 (g) This section does not apply to:
- 16 (1) the exemption provided by Section 54.216 or to any
- 17 other exemption provided to a high school student for enrollment in
- 18 a dual credit course or other course for which the student may earn
- 19 joint high school and college credit; or
- 20 (2) any provision of this code that authorizes or
- 21 requires the payment of tuition or fees at the rates provided for
- 22 residents of this state by a person who is not a resident of this
- 23 state for purposes of Subchapter B.
- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to
- 25 eligibility for an exemption from the payment of tuition or other
- 26 fees beginning with tuition and fees charged for the 2012 fall
- 27 semester.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

5 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
