| 5 | SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is |
| 6 | amended by adding Section 54.2001 to read as follows: |
| 7 | Sec. 54.2001. CONTINUED RECEIPT OF EXEMPTIONS CONDITIONAL. |
| 8 | (a) Notwithstanding any other law but subject to Subsection (d), |
| 9 | after initially qualifying under this subchapter for a mandatory or |
| 10 | discretionary exemption from the payment of tuition or other fees |
| 11 | for enrollment during a semester or term at an institution of higher |
| 12 | education, a person may continue to receive the exemption for a |
| 13 | subsequent semester or term only if the person: |
| 14 | (1) makes satisfactory academic progress toward a |
| 15 | degree or a certificate as determined by the institution in |
| 16 | accordance with the institution's policy regarding eligibility for |
| 17 | financial aid; and |
| 18 | (2) as of the beginning of the semester or term, has |
| 19 | not completed more than six semester credit hours in excess of the |
| 20 | minimum number of semester credit hours required to complete the |
| 21 | person's degree or certificate program. |
| 22 | (b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(2), the computation of a |
| 23 | person's total number of completed semester credit hours includes |
| 24 | transfer credit hours that count toward the nerson's degree or |

- 2 (1) hours earned exclusively by examination;
- 3 (2) hours earned for a course for which the person
- 4 received credit toward the person's high school academic
- 5 requirements; and
- 6 (3) hours earned for developmental coursework that an
- 7 <u>institution of higher education required the person to take under</u>
- 8 Section 51.3062 or under the former provisions of Section 51.306.
- 9 (c) If on the completion of any semester or term a person
- 10 <u>fails to meet any requirement of Subsection (a), the person may not</u>
- 11 receive an exemption from the payment of tuition or other fees
- 12 described by Subsection (a) for the next semester or term in which
- 13 the person enrolls. A person may become eligible to receive an
- 14 exemption in a subsequent semester or term if the person:
- (1) completes a semester or term during which the
- 16 person is not eligible for an exemption; and
- 17 (2) meets each requirement of Subsection (a).
- 18 (d) If a requirement imposed by this section for the
- 19 continued receipt of a specific exemption conflicts with another
- 20 requirement imposed by statute for that exemption, the stricter
- 21 <u>requirement prevails.</u>
- (e) This section does not apply to the exemption provided by
- 23 <u>Section 54.216 or to any other exemption provided to a high school</u>
- 24 student for enrollment in a dual credit course or other course for
- 25 which the student may earn joint high school and college credit.
- 26 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to
- 27 eligibility for an exemption from the payment of tuition or other

- 1 fees beginning with tuition and fees charged for the 2012 spring
- 2 semester.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
