A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to requiring the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
3	to create a tool to allow prospective students to compare
4	institutions of higher education by certain criteria.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 61.09021 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 61.09021. COMPARISON TOOL. (a) The board shall make
9	available to the public on the board's Internet website a search
10	tool that allows a person to compare institutions of higher
11	education that meet certain criteria selected by the person,
12	including offering a particular major or program of study.
13	(b) The comparison tool required under this section must:
14	(1) be accessible from the board's Internet website
15	home page by use of not more than three links;
16	(2) allow a user to identify institutions according
17	<u>to:</u>
18	(A) major field or program of study;
19	(B) high school class rank; and
20	(C) a score on a generally recognized test or
21	assessment used in college and university undergraduate
22	admissions, including the Scholastic Assessment Test and the
23	American College Test; and
24	(3) be accessible to the public without requiring

1 registration or use of a user name, password, or other user 2 identification. 3 (c) The comparison tool required under this section must generate a comparison chart in a grid format that: 4 5 (1) lists the institutions of higher education that match a user's search criteria; and 6 7 (2) provides the following information for 8 institution listed: (A) the average annual cost of tuition and fees 9 10 for an undergraduate student enrolled for 12 semester credit hours 11 per semester; (B) the percentage of applicants with similar 12 high school class rank accepted in the freshman class for the most 13 14 recent academic year for which the information is available; 15 (C) the percentage of applicants with similar scores on a generally recognized test or assessment used in 16 17 undergraduate admissions accepted in the freshman class for the most recent academic year for which the information is available; 18 19 (D) the four-year and six-year graduation rates of full-time degree-seeking undergraduate students with a similar 20 21 high school class rank and score on a generally recognized test or 22 assessment used in undergraduate admissions for: (i) the institution as a whole; and 23

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graduates of the major or program selected for comparison; and

(ii) the major or program selected for

(E) the average starting salary in the state for

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comparison;

- 1 <u>(F)</u> a link to the institution's online resume.
- 2 (d) The Internet page displaying the comparison chart must
- 3 <u>include a link to the Internet website of the Texas Workforce</u>
- 4 Commission.
- 5 (e) Each institution of higher education shall provide to
- 6 the board the data required under Subsection (c) not later than
- 7 October 1 of each year. The board shall update the comparison tool
- 8 as soon as practicable after receiving data from each institution.
- 9 SECTION 2. (a) Each institution of higher education shall
- 10 provide the categories of data to be included in the comparison
- 11 search tool required by Section 61.09021, Education Code, as added
- 12 by this Act, to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 13 beginning with the 2011-2012 academic year.
- 14 (b) Not later than September 1, 2012, the Texas Higher
- 15 Education Coordinating Board shall create and post on the board's
- 16 Internet website the comparison tool required by Section 61.09021,
- 17 Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
