## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-8 relating to tuition and fee exemptions at public institutions of 1-9 higher education for certain Texas military veterans.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-10 1-11 SECTION 1. Section 54.203, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-3) to read as follows: 1-12

(a-3) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(4), a person who meets 1-13 the requirements of Subsection (a)(4), other than the requirement that the person must have served on active military duty for more 1-14 1**-**15 1**-**16 than the stated number of days, is entitled to the exemption provided by Subsection (a)(4) regardless of the length of the 1-17 member's active military duty if the person was a member of the Texas National Guard or the Texas Air National Guard who was 1-18 1-19 assigned to a theater of combat operation with the armed forces of the United States. SECTION 2. Subsection (a-3), Section 54.203, Education 1-20 1-21

1-22 1-23 Code, as added by this Act, applies beginning with tuition and fees at a public institution of higher education for the 2011 fall 1-24 1**-**25 1**-**26 semester. Tuition and fees for a term or semester before the 2011 fall semester are covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in 1-27 1-28 effect for that purpose.

1-29 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-30 1-31 1-32 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-33 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
