- 2 relating to a physician's authority to delegate prescribing acts to
- 3 physician assistants.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 157.0542(a), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) On determining that the conditions of Subsection (b)
- 8 have been met, the board may waive or modify any of the site or
- 9 supervision requirements for a physician to delegate the carrying
- 10 out or signing of prescription drug orders to an advanced practice
- 11 nurse or physician assistant under Sections 157.052, 157.053,
- 12 157.054, [and] 157.0541, and 157.0543, or under board rules. The
- 13 board may not waive the limitation on the number of primary or
- 14 alternate practice sites at which a physician may delegate the
- 15 carrying out or signing of prescription drug orders or the number of
- 16 advanced practice nurses or physician assistants to whom a
- 17 physician may delegate the carrying out or signing of prescription
- 18 drug orders, except as provided by Subsection (b-1)(1).
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Section 157.0543 to read as follows:
- Sec. 157.0543. PRESCRIBING AT OTHER SITES. (a) This
- 22 section applies only to the delegation of prescriptive authority
- 23 at:
- 24 (1) a medical school or dental school or an outpatient

- 1 <u>clinic associated with a medical or dental school;</u>
- 2 (2) a hospital, including any outpatient facility or
- 3 clinic of a hospital;
- 4 (3) a hospice established under 40 T.A.C. Section
- 5 97.403 or defined by 42 C.F.R. Section 418.3;
- 6 (4) a facility maintained or operated by this state;
- 7 (5) a clinic maintained or operated by the United
- 8 States; and
- 9 (6) a clinic owned or operated by a physician who
- 10 treats patients within the physician's area of specialty and who
- 11 uses other forms of treatment, including surgery, with the issuance
- 12 of a prescription for a majority of the patients.
- 13 (b) Notwithstanding Section 157.0511(b), at a location
- 14 described by Subsection (a), a physician may delegate to one or more
- 15 physician assistants acting under adequate physician supervision
- 16 the administering, providing, carrying out, or signing of a
- 17 prescription drug order for a controlled substance listed in
- 18 Schedule II as established by the commissioner of state health
- 19 services under Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code.
- 20 (c) Physician supervision of the carrying out and signing of
- 21 prescription drug orders must conform to what a reasonable, prudent
- 22 physician would find consistent with sound medical judgment but may
- 23 vary with the education and experience of the particular physician
- 24 assistant. A physician shall provide continuous supervision, but
- 25 the constant physical presence of the physician is not required.
- 26 (d) An alternate physician may provide appropriate
- 27 supervision on a temporary basis as defined and established by

- 1 board rule.
- 2 (e) A physician's authority to delegate under Subsection
- 3 (b) is limited as follows:
- 4 (1) the delegation must be made under a physician's
- 5 order, standing medical order, or standing delegation order, or
- 6 <u>another order or protocol as defined by the board;</u>
- 7 (2) the delegation must occur in a location described
- 8 by Subsection (a) in which the physician practices; and
- 9 (3) the delegation may not permit the carrying out or
- 10 signing of prescription drug orders for the care or treatment of the
- 11 patients of any other physician without the prior consent of that
- 12 physician.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
