5	SECTION 1. Chapter 202, Property Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 202.012 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 202.012. FLAG DISPLAY. (a) In this section, "owner"
8	has the meaning assigned by Section 201.003, except that the term
9	also includes a relative or tenant of an owner.
10	(b) A property owners' association may not, except as
11	provided in this section, adopt or enforce a dedicatory instrument
12	provision that prohibits, restricts, or has the effect of
13	prohibiting or restricting an owner from the display of:
14	(1) the flag of the United States of America;
15	(2) the flag of the State of Texas; or
16	(3) an official or replica flag of any branch of the
17	United States armed forces.
18	(c) A property owners' association may adopt or enforce
19	reasonable dedicatory instrument provisions:
20	(1) that require:
21	(A) the flag of the United States be displayed in
22	accordance with 4 U.S.C. Sections 5-10;
23	(B) the flag of the State of Texas be displayed in
24	accordance with Chapter 3100, Government Code;

(C) a flagpole attached to a dwelling or a 1 freestanding flagpole be constructed of permanent, long-lasting 2 materials, with a finish appropriate to the materials used in the 3 construction of the flagpole and harmonious with the dwelling; 4 (D) the display of a flag, or the location and 5 6 construction of the supporting flagpole, to comply with applicable zoning ordinances, easements, and setbacks of record; and 7 8 (E) a displayed flag and the flagpole on which it is flown be maintained in good condition and that any deteriorated 9 10 flag or deteriorated or structurally unsafe flagpole be repaired, replaced, or removed; 11 12 (2) that regulate the location of the flagpole on which a flag is displayed, except that the regulation may not 13 prevent the flag from being seen or a flagpole from being installed 14 15 or erected; (3) that govern the size of a displayed flag; and 16 17 (4) that regulate the size, location, and intensity of any lights used to <u>illuminate a displayed flag</u>. 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2.2
