A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2 | relating to the creation of the Texas Veterans Council. |
| 3 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 4 | SECTION 1. Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by |
| 5 | adding Subchapter S to read as follows: |
| 6 | SUBCHAPTER S. TEXAS VETERANS COUNCIL |
| 7 | Sec. 531.751. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: |
| 8 | (1) "Council" means the Texas Veterans Council. |
| 9 | (2) "Servicemember" has the meaning assigned by |
| 10 | Section 161.551, Health and Safety Code. |
| 11 | Sec. 531.752. TEXAS VETERANS COUNCIL. (a) The Texas |
| 12 | Veterans Council is established to: |
| 13 | (1) provide guidance to and coordinate health and |
| 14 | human services systems that assist servicemembers and their |
| 15 | <pre>families;</pre> |
| 16 | (2) ensure that servicemembers and their families are |
| 17 | aware of and have access to needed services; |
| 18 | (3) improve the efficiency and effectiveness of state, |
| 19 | federal, and local agencies and of advisory councils in addressing |
| 20 | issues affecting the health and well-being of servicemembers and |
| 21 | their families; |
| 22 | (4) prioritize and mobilize resources for |
| 23 | servicemembers, including state appropriations for veterans |
| 24 | health and human services; and |

| 1 | (5) facilitate an integrated, efficient approach to |
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| 2 | identifying and providing outreach to servicemembers and their |
| 3 | families, including web-based outreach and outreach through local |
| 4 | community events. |
| 5 | (b) The council shall: |
| 6 | (1) promote a common vision of desired outcomes for |
| 7 | servicemembers and their families and encourage shared |
| 8 | accountability for achieving those outcomes; |
| 9 | (2) align allocations of resources with |
| 10 | evidence-based policies that promote the health, well-being, and |
| 11 | community reintegration of servicemembers and their families; and |
| 12 | (3) sustain, formalize, and guide collaborative |
| 13 | relationships between state, federal, and private agencies and |
| 14 | veterans service organizations. |
| 15 | (c) Subject to Subsection (d), the council is composed of |
| 16 | the following: |
| 17 | (1) the executive commissioner; |
| 18 | (2) the executive director of the Texas Veterans |
| 19 | Commission; |
| 20 | (3) the commissioner of the General Land Office; |
| 21 | (4) the adjutant general; |
| 22 | (5) the director of the Texas Correctional Office on |
| 23 | Offenders with Medical or Mental Impairments; |
| 24 | (6) a representative of the United States Veterans |
| 25 | Health Administration; |
| 26 | (7) at least one licensed physician, licensed |
| 27 | psychologist, or other licensed mental health professional, with |

- 1 demonstrated expert knowledge in the evidence-based treatment of
- 2 trauma induced by war, appointed by the executive commissioner;
- 3 (8) one or more servicemembers appointed by the
- 4 executive commissioner who work in the delivery of services to
- 5 veterans, active servicemembers, or their families;
- 6 (9) a representative of the United States Department
- 7 of Defense stationed in this state with expert knowledge of the
- 8 treatment provided to servicemembers by federal agencies; and
- 9 (10) other representatives of health and human
- 10 services agencies, appointed by the executive commissioner.
- 11 (d) An individual listed in Subsections (c)(1)-(5) may
- 12 designate another individual as having authority to act on behalf
- 13 of the individual at council meetings and with respect to council
- 14 functions.
- (e) An organization or agency not represented by an
- 16 individual listed in Subsections (c)(1)-(10) that provides
- 17 services to servicemembers and their families may participate in
- 18 and contribute to the performance of the council's duties through
- 19 procedures established by the council.
- 20 (f) The members of the council annually shall elect one
- 21 member to serve as the presiding officer.
- 22 (g) Council meetings are held at the call of the presiding
- 23 officer.
- (h) The council is administratively attached to the
- 25 commission but is independent of direction by the commission or the
- 26 executive commissioner. The commission may provide administrative
- 27 support and resources to the council as necessary to enable the

- 1 council to perform its duties.
- 2 (i) The state agencies represented on the council may
- 3 provide staff support as needed to the council.
- 4 (j) The council is not subject to Chapter 2110.
- 5 (k) A member of the council is not entitled to compensation,
- 6 but is entitled to reimbursement of the member's travel expenses as
- 7 provided in the General Appropriations Act for state employees.
- 8 Sec. 531.753. DUTIES. (a) The council shall:
- 9 (1) identify appropriations, including appropriations
- 10 for initiatives that maximize access to United States Veterans
- 11 Health Administration resources, that may be modified in the next
- 12 legislative appropriation requests to eliminate waste or increase
- 13 available services and, not later than May 1 of each even-numbered
- 14 year, prepare a report recommending those modifications for
- 15 consideration during the development of the next biennial
- 16 legislative appropriations request;
- 17 (2) promote and coordinate initiatives that guide
- 18 servicemembers and their families to appropriate federal, state,
- 19 and local resources;
- 20 (3) identify methods to improve case management
- 21 services provided by a veterans county service officer through
- 22 <u>additional training</u>, increased productivity, and additional
- 23 <u>resources;</u>
- 24 (4) identify methods to ensure that servicemembers
- 25 <u>receive appropriate assessment, diagnoses, and intervention</u>
- 26 services;
- 27 (5) identify and promote effective methods of serving

- 1 the needs of female servicemembers, including the identification
- 2 and treatment of victims of military sexual trauma;
- 3 (6) identify methods to promote health and
- 4 sustainability of the families of servicemembers; and
- 5 (7) promote servicemember involvement in the planning
- 6 and provision of health and human services for servicemembers and
- 7 <u>their families.</u>
- 8 (b) The state agency members of the council may, as
- 9 appropriate, enter into memoranda of understanding with other
- 10 agencies to implement any method, process, policy, or
- 11 recommendation identified or developed under Subsection (a).
- 12 Before a method, process, policy, or recommendation is implemented,
- 13 the council shall:
- 14 (1) identify:
- 15 (A) the timeline and proposed outcome of
- 16 implementing the method, process, policy, or recommendation; and
- 17 (B) benchmarks that may be used to measure the
- 18 success of the implementation of the method, process, policy, or
- 19 recommendation; and
- 20 (2) assign to the appropriate members of the council
- 21 responsibility for implementing the method, process, policy, or
- 22 <u>recommendation</u>.
- 23 <u>(c) The council may collect data necessary to conduct the</u>
- 24 council's duties or implement the council's recommendations and
- 25 shall use any reports or information produced by other entities
- 26 related to servicemembers and their families to inform the council.
- Sec. 531.754. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The council may

- 1 accept gifts, grants, and donations from any public or private
- 2 source, including grants and other money from the Texas Veterans
- 3 Commission, the Department of State Health Services, or other state
- 4 agencies and institutions of higher education, to pay expenses
- 5 incurred in performing its duties under this subchapter.
- 6 Sec. 531.755. REPORT BY COUNCIL. Not later than December 1
- 7 of each even-numbered year, the council shall submit a report to the
- 8 governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of
- 9 representatives, and members of the legislature that contains:
- 10 (1) the requests, plans, and recommendations of the
- 11 council, including recommendations of any legislation that is
- 12 needed to further develop and maintain a statewide system of
- 13 quality health care and human services for servicemembers and their
- 14 families; and
- 15 (2) information regarding the implementation by the
- 16 members of the council of any method, process, policy, or
- 17 recommendation, including information regarding whether the
- 18 implementation has proceeded in accordance with the timeline,
- 19 outcome, and benchmarks identified by the council.
- Sec. 531.756. SUNSET PROVISION. The council is subject to
- 21 Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as
- 22 provided by that chapter, the council is abolished and this
- 23 <u>subchapter expires September 1, 2017.</u>
- SECTION 2. (a) The executive commissioner of the Health
- 25 and Human Services Commission shall appoint the members of the
- 26 Texas Veterans Council as required by Sections 531.752(c)(7), (8),
- 27 and (10), Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than

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- 1 September 30, 2011.
- 2 (b) The Texas Veterans Council established by Section
- 3 531.752, Government Code, as added by this Act, shall convene its
- 4 initial meeting not later than November 1, 2011.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act does not make an appropriation. A
- 6 provision in this Act that creates a new governmental program,
- 7 creates a new entitlement, or imposes a new duty on a governmental
- 8 entity is not mandatory during a fiscal period for which the
- 9 legislature has not made a specific appropriation to implement the
- 10 provision.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
