 Sec. 434.155. PRESIDING OFFICER. The executive director of
- the Texas Veterans Commission shall serve as the presiding officer.
- Sec. 434.156. MEETINGS. The council shall meet at least
- annually and at the call of the presiding officer.

 Sec. 434.157. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. (a) The council is administratively attached to the Texas Veterans Commission. The Texas Veterans Commission may provide administrative support and resources to the council as necessary to enable the council to perform its duties.
- (b) A state agency represented on the council shall support the agency's involvement with the council and provide staff support as needed to the council.
- (c) The designated representative of any organization or agency that accepts an invitation to serve on a coordinating workgroup of the council under Section 434.154(g) is not entitled to compensation, but is entitled to reimbursement of the representative's travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660 and the General Appropriations Act.
- Sec. 434.158. REPORT BY COUNCIL. Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the council shall submit a report to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and chairs of the appropriate committees of the legislature detailing the work of the council and recommendations.
- SECTION 2. The presiding officer of the Texas Coordinating Council for Veterans Services shall call the initial meeting of the council not later than November 1, 2011.
- SECTION 3. This Act does not make an appropriation or require a specific appropriation. Any new duty imposed on a state agency as a result of the Act can be performed through the appropriations provided by the legislature as part of the existing responsibilities of the state agency.
 - SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
