A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study by the comptroller of public accounts of the
- 3 economic impact of the Texas-Mexico border wall in the State of
- 4 Texas.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) The comptroller of public accounts shall
- 7 study the economic impact of the installation of the border wall
- 8 near the Texas-Mexico border on this state, on local governments,
- 9 and on businesses, families, and individuals.
- 10 (b) In completing the study under this section, the
- 11 comptroller of public accounts shall:
- 12 (1) focus on the effects of the installation of the
- 13 wall on those businesses, families, and individuals who own land or
- 14 operate on land that falls between the international boundary and
- 15 the border wall; and
- 16 (2) analyze each parcel of land that falls between the
- 17 international boundary and the border wall and each business that
- 18 operates on such land.
- 19 (c) At the request of the comptroller of public accounts, a
- 20 state agency or local government shall provide information and
- 21 assistance in conducting the study under this section.
- 22 (d) The comptroller of public accounts shall provide
- 23 updates on the progress of the study required by this section as
- 24 requested at interim committee hearings conducted by the House

- 1 Committee on Border and Intergovernmental Affairs and the Senate
- 2 Committee on International Relations and Trade.
- 3 (e) Not later than December 1, 2012, the comptroller of
- 4 public accounts shall report the results of the study conducted
- 5 under this section to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the
- 6 house of representatives, and the presiding officers of the House
- 7 Committee on Border and Intergovernmental Affairs and the Senate
- 8 Committee on International Relations and Trade.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act expires January 1, 2013.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
