A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the distribution of the emergency service fee for
- 3 wireless telecommunications connections and the prepaid 9-1-1
- 4 emergency service fee.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 771.056(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (d) If the commission approves the plan, it shall allocate
- 9 to the region from the money collected under Sections 771.071 $_{\overline{\tau}}$
- 10 771.0711, and 771.072 and appropriated to the commission the amount
- 11 that the commission considers appropriate to operate 9-1-1 service
- 12 in the region according to the plan and contracts executed under
- 13 Section 771.078.
- SECTION 2. Sections 771.0711(c) and (g), Health and Safety
- 15 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (c) Money collected under Subsection (b) may be used only
- 17 for services related to 9-1-1 services, including automatic number
- 18 identification and automatic location information services. Not
- 19 later than the 15th day after the end of the month in which the money
- 20 is collected, the commission shall distribute to each emergency
- 21 communication district that does not participate in the state
- 22 system and regional planning commission a portion of the money that
- 23 bears the same proportion to the total amount collected that the
- 24 population of the area served by the district or regional planning

- 1 commission bears to the population of the state. The remaining
- 2 money collected under Subsection (b) shall be deposited to the
- 3 9-1-1 services fee account.
- 4 (g) On receipt of an invoice from a wireless service
- 5 provider for reasonable expenses for network facilities, including
- 6 equipment, installation, maintenance, and associated
- 7 implementation costs, the commission or an emergency services
- 8 district of a home-rule municipality or an emergency communication
- 9 district created under Chapter 772 or regional planning commission
- 10 shall reimburse the wireless service provider in accordance with
- 11 state law for all expenses related to 9-1-1 service.
- SECTION 3. Sections 771.077(d) and (e), Health and Safety
- 13 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 14 (d) The comptroller shall:
- 15 (1) remit to the commission money collected under this
- 16 section for fees provided by Sections 771.0711 and 771.0712, and
- 17 associated late penalties;
- 18 (2) deposit to the 9-1-1 services fee account any
- 19 money collected under this section for fees provided by Section
- 20 771.071 and associated late penalties; and
- 21 (3) deposit to the account as authorized by Section
- 22 771.072 any money collected under this section for fees provided by
- 23 Section 771.072 and associated late penalties.
- 24 (e) The commission shall:
- 25 (1) deposit or distribute the money remitted under
- 26 Subsection (d)(1) as Section 771.0711 provides for fees received
- 27 under that section and Section 771.0712; and

- 1 (2) distribute the money remitted under Subsection
- 2 (d)(2) and appropriated to the commission under contracts as
- 3 provided by Section $\frac{771.078(b)(1)}{771.078(b)}$.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 771.078(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) In making contracts under this section, the commission
- 7 shall ensure that each regional planning commission receives money
- 8 for 9-1-1 service in two separately computed amounts as provided by
- 9 this subsection. The commission must provide each regional
- 10 planning commission with:
- 11 $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ an amount of money equal to the total of the
- 12 revenue from the emergency service fees collected under Section
- 13 771.071 that is deposited in the treasury and appropriated to the
- 14 commission multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 15 amount of those fees collected from the region and the denominator
- 16 of which is the total amount of those fees collected in this state +
- 17 and.
- 18 (2) an amount of money equal to the total of the
- 19 revenue from the emergency service fee for wireless
- 20 telecommunications connections under Section 771.0711 that is
- 21 deposited in the treasury and appropriated to the commission
- 22 multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is the population
- 23 of the region and the denominator of which is the population of this
- 24 state.
- 25 SECTION 5. Section 771.079(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 (b) The account consists of:

- 1 (1) fees deposited in the fund as provided by Sections
- 2 771.071 and 771.0711; and
- 3 (2) notwithstanding Section 404.071, Government Code,
- 4 all interest attributable to money held in the account.
- 5 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 6 fees collected after September 1, 2011.
- 7 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect on September 1, 2011.
