## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to access to certain archaic information. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 552, Government Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Section 552.0215 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 552.0215. RIGHT OF ACCESS TO CERTAIN INFORMATION AFTER 75 YEARS. (a) Except as specifically provided by other law, 7 including another provision of this chapter, information that is 8 9 not confidential but is excepted from required disclosure under Subchapter C is public information and is available to the public on 10 or after the 75th anniversary of the date the information was 11 originally created or received by the governmental body. 12 (b) This section does not limit the authority of a 13 14 governmental body to establish retention periods for records under 15 applicable law. SECTION 2. Section 201.009(b), Local Government Code, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 (b) Any local government record to which public access is 18 denied under Chapter 552, Government Code, including a birth record 19 maintained by a local registrar, is, if still in existence, open to 20 public inspection 75 years after it was originally created or 21 received. However, [a birth record maintained by a local registrar 22 23 is, if still in existence, open to public inspection 100 years after was originally created or received and] a death record 24

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1 maintained by a local registrar is, if still in existence, open to 2 public inspection 55 years after it was originally created or 3 received. This subsection does not limit the authority of a 4 governing body or an elected county officer to establish retention 5 periods for records under Section 203.042.

6 SECTION 3. Section 159.002(d), Occupations Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

8 (d) The prohibitions of this chapter continue to apply to a 9 confidential communication or record relating to a patient 10 regardless of when the patient receives the services of a 11 physician, except for medical records at least <u>75</u> [<del>100</del>] years old 12 that are requested for historical research purposes.

13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
