A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment exempting political
- 2 subdivisions from unfunded legislative mandates and authorizing
- 3 the legislature to provide funding for legislative mandates on
- 4 political subdivisions.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Article III, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 7 adding Section 68 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 68. (a) In this section, "legislative mandate" means
- 9 a statutory provision enacted by the legislature that requires a
- 10 political subdivision to establish, expand, or modify an activity
- 11 in a way that requires an expenditure of revenue that would not have
- 12 been required in the absence of the provision.
- (b) For purposes of this section, a legislative mandate is
- 14 considered to be unfunded during any period for which the
- 15 legislature has not appropriated money, if authorized by this
- 16 constitution to do so, or otherwise provided a source of funding
- 17 other than revenue of the political subdivision that is estimated
- 18 to be sufficient to meet the cost of financing the expenditure, as
- 19 <u>determined by law. The legislature by general law or appropriation</u>
- 20 may provide for reimbursement or other payment of the costs
- 21 incurred by political subdivisions in complying with an unfunded
- 22 legislative mandate.
- 23 <u>(c) A political subdivision is exempt from a legislative</u>
- 24 mandate during a period in which the mandate is unfunded. The

- 1 legislature by general law may authorize a commission or other
- 2 body, which may include members of the legislature, to identify
- 3 legislative mandates and determine whether a legislative mandate is
- 4 considered unfunded for a specific period.
- 5 (d) The legislature by general law may provide a method by
- 6 which an unfunded legislative mandate is suspended or expires.
- 7 <u>(e) This section does not apply to:</u>
- 8 (1) a legislative mandate enacted before January 1,
- 9 2011;
- 10 (2) a legislative mandate that is necessary to comply
- 11 with a requirement of the Texas Constitution, federal law, or a
- 12 <u>court order; or</u>
- 13 <u>(3) a legislative mandate that creates a criminal</u>
- 14 offense or changes the elements of a criminal offense.
- 15 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 16 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2011.
- 17 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 18 proposition: "The constitutional amendment exempting political
- 19 subdivisions from unfunded legislative mandates."
