A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 proposing a constitutional amendment revising the order of 2 legislative business to permit legislative committees to consider 3 matters during the first 60 days of a regular session.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 5(b), Article III, Texas Constitution, 6 is amended to read as follows:

7 (b) When convened in regular <u>session</u> [Session], the first 60 [thirty] days thereof shall be devoted to the introduction of bills 8 9 and resolutions, acting upon emergency appropriations, passing upon the confirmation of the recess appointees of the Governor, and 10 11 such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in 12 special messages to the Legislature. During that period, [the succeeding thirty days of the regular session of the Legislature] 13 14 the various committees of each House may [shall] hold hearings to consider all bills, [and] resolutions, and other matters then 15 16 pending[+] and such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor. During the remainder of the session, the Legislature 17 shall act upon such bills and resolutions as may be then pending and 18 upon such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in 19 20 special messages to the Legislature.

21 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 22 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2011. 23 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the 24 proposition: "The constitutional amendment revising the order of
