WHEREAS, In 1993, Mr. Key was promoted to the position of senior inspector in charge of high-rise evacuation, and from 1993 to 2008, he served as executive director of the Houston High-Rise Triad Committee; since 2000, he has served as chief inspector in the Fire Marshal's Office, which has included serving as chief over the High-Rise Inspection and Evacuation Team and managing public education and information technology for the Fire Marshal's Office; and

WHEREAS, A dedicated public servant, Mr. Key has also served for many years as a volunteer for Camp Janus, an annual camping

experience for children that have survived severe burn injury; he served as the camp's director for six years; and

WHEREAS, Charles Key is well known for his able leadership in the Houston Fire Department, and he is respected for his courage and the dedication to his profession that he has displayed throughout his career; in addition to having dealt with the unique challenges of a fire inspector's duties, Mr. Key became an ordained minister and currently serves as pastor of Tree of Life Fellowship Church in Conroe; now, therefore, be it
