IN RE: HB188 by Sheffield (Relating to limitations on the use of eminent domain authority.), As Introduced

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

HB 188 would result in no direct fiscal impact to state governmental entities.

Agencies report that the bill's language could result in potential delays experienced by entities seeking to obtain land through eminent domain processes due to the uncertainty created by the new requirement for a determination that the land is necessary for public use. Because there is no detail provided on how property would be deemed necessary for public use, or what entity would make such a determination, the language creates uncertainty over when a property may be acquired by eminent domain.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
