IN RE: HB452 by Lucio III (Relating to temporary housing between academic terms for certain postsecondary students who have been under the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

Under provisions of the bill, a full time student who has been under the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services at any time before the student's 18th birthday may request assistance from the institution of higher education the student is attending in locating temporary housing for any period beginning on the last day of an academic term and ending on the first day of the immediately following academic term. For requesting students who also demonstrate a financial need, the institution may provide a stipend to cover reasonable costs of temporary housing, or, provide direct temporary housing. An institution may use any available revenue, including legislative appropriations, and may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations for the purpose of the act. Based on information provided by institutions of higher education, the estimated number of students who would seek assistance under the new provision would not be significant.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
