IN RE: HB720 by Hartnett (Relating to the designation of a person as a vexatious litigant.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Civil Practice and Remedies Code to permit explicitly a person who has been found to be a vexatious litigant subject to a prefiling order to appeal the prefiling order to a court of appeals. To the extent the bill would increase filings in the courts of appeals; no significant increase is anticipated to the workloads of the appellate courts statewide. The bill would take effect September 1, 2011.

## **Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
