**FISCAL NOTE, 82ND LEGISLATIVE REGULAR SESSION**

**IN RE: HB1956** by Thompson (Relating to appeal of an order of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission or the commission's administrator refusing, canceling, or suspending a license or permit.), **As Passed 2nd House**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Alcoholic Beverage Code to extend the requirement that an appeal of an order of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission or the commission's administrator refusing, canceling, or suspending a license or permit be tried before a judge from 10 to 20 days. The Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission indicates that no fiscal implication from the bill is anticipated. This bill takes effect September 1, 2011.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
