#### **Fiscal Analysis**

The bill would require the Texas Board of Criminal Justice to sell property in Brazoria County through the General Land Office.

#### Methodology

The General Land Office estimates a one-time General Revenue gain of \$2.2 million for the sale of the property. The Department of Criminal Justice estimates a loss of \$700,000 in agricultural receipts (Appropriated Receipts) per fiscal year as the result of a reduction in the production of cotton, grain, field crops, edible crops, and cattle.

#### **Technology**

No impact to technology is anticipated.

### **Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
