IN RE: HB2025 by McClendon (Relating to the implementation of county solid waste management programs in the extraterritorial jurisdictions of certain municipalities.), Committee Report 1st House, Substituted

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Health and Safety Code to authorize a commissioners court in a county with a population of more than 1.5 million and in which at least 75 percent of the population resides in a single municipality to establish a mandatory program to regulate solid waste in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality if the municipality does not provide solid waste disposal services in the area.

Local Government Impact

There could be a fiscal impact to a county that chose to establish a solid waste program; however, those amounts would vary by locality and are not anticipated to be significant.
