IN RE: HB3365 by White (Relating to a warden or certain facility employees providing information or a recommendation to a parole panel regarding an inmate eligible for parole.), As Introduced

## No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Government Code, Chapter 508, to require the Board of Pardons and Paroles to implement a policy that would permit a warden or other senior employee to provide a parole panel information on an offender's behavior and progress while incarcerated, and to permit the warden or employee to make a recommendation regarding the offender's release. The Texas Department of Criminal Justice and the Board of Pardons and Paroles anticipate no significant fiscal impact from the bill.

## **Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
