IN RE: SB61 by Zaffirini (Relating to minimum standards for juvenile case managers.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Human Resources Code Subchapter C, Chapter 141 to create minimum standards for juvenile case managers, which include a code of ethics, minimum education requirements, and training standards. For this analysis, it is assumed that any work resulting from the passage of this bill could be reasonably absorbed with current resources. This analysis determines that implementing the provisions of the bill would not pose a significant fiscal impact to the state.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
