IN RE: SB71 by Nelson (Relating to certain reports submitted and analyses conducted regarding health and human services.), Committee Report 2nd House, Substituted

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would eliminate or reduce certain reporting requirements of health and human services agencies. According to the affected agencies (Department of Aging and Disability Services, Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services, Department of Family and Protective Services, Department of State Health Services, and Health and Human Services Commission), no significant fiscal impact is expected; staff responsible for preparing eliminated reports could see a reduction in workload, but it is not assumed to be significant enough to make reductions in staffing.
