IN RE: SB176 by Huffman (Relating to student eligibility for tuition rebates offered by general academic teaching institutions.), **As Engrossed**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>

The bill amends the eligibility requirements under Education Code Sec. 54.0065(a) for receiving a \$1000 rebate of tuition by no longer counting dual-credit high school courses against the hour limitation. Although excluding this course credit from the limitation will likely result in additional students qualifying the rebate, based on estimates provided by general academic institutions, this impact is not considered significant.
