IN RE: SB390 by Hegar (Relating to the continuing issuance of freshwater fishing stamps by the Parks and Wildlife Department.), **As Introduced**

Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds for SB390, As Introduced: an impact of \$0 through the biennium ending August 31, 2013.

The bill would make no appropriation but could provide the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill.

Fiscal Analysis

The bill would amend the Parks and Wildlife Code to repeal §43.809 (the expiration of the Freshwater Fishing Stamp on September 1, 2014). The bill would take immediate effect if the bill receives two-thirds the vote of members in both houses. Otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2011.

Methodology

According to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, after netting agent commission fees, approximately \$5,830,994 per fiscal year beginning in fiscal year 2015 would continue to be deposited to the credit of the General Revenue-Dedicated Game, Fish and Water Safety Account No. 9.

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
