**IN RE: SB587** by Uresti (Relating to jurisdiction in certain proceedings brought by the attorney general with respect to charitable trusts.), **As Introduced**

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>

This bill would amend the Property Code and expand the jurisdiction of a statutory probate court of Travis County to include concurrent jurisdiction in a proceeding brought by the Office of the Attorney General alleging breach of a fiduciary duty with respect to a charitable trust created by a will that has been admitted to probate. It is anticipated that any additional costs associated with implementation of the legislation could be absorbed within existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
