**IN RE: SB602** by Rodriguez (Relating to allowing a governmental body to redact certain personal information under the public information law without the necessity of requesting a decision from the attorney general and the calculation of certain deadlines under the public information law.), **As Introduced**

The bill would amend Government Code to allow governmental entities to redact certain personal information requested under the Public Information Act without requiring a decision from the attorney general. Specific types of personal information referenced in the bill include: vehicle license data; vehicle registration data; personal identification data; and credit card, debit card, charge card, and access card numbers. The bill would also clarify the determination of when a PIA request is officially received by an entity.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2011 and apply only to requests received on or after that date.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
